



A second pancake breakfast was discussed for early fall. It was scheduled for Sept. 14 after a short discussion.


The Progressive Dinner was tentatively set for October 4 after all attempts to schedule it for Dick Riha's Hawaian vacation period failed.


Programs: The program for the May meeting will be a white or slightly tinted elephant sale. For April we will have a movie.


Era House Dedicated as New Club Meeting Hall

TECHNICAL TALK by Dick Riha 556-4355

The March seminar was a great success, with 18 men and 2 ladies showing up. The day started with Keith Justice bringing his rear end (Model A) to the seminar for rebuilding and installing an overdrive. This proved to be quite a project for Bob Ferazzi and Keith and whoever wanted to get dirty. There were 6 more Model A's that attended the seminar with only 2 requiring attention. The most serious problem arose when Leslie Nesbitt told us of a squeak coming from the front end. Upon inspection of the front wheels it was discovered that the driver side wheel bearings were dry. The bearings from both sides were cleaned and repacked. We suggested that they be replaced before the Yuma trip.

The other major problems were with Tom Osborne's newly acquired '30 Sedan. For further information ask Tom about distributor shafts, fuel sediment bowls, fuel lines, and distributor rotors and cams.

With so much interest in overdrives and rearend rebuilding, I contacted Jerry Sterling and he will be hosting the Friday, April 11 seminar, on rearend rebuilding at 7:30 PM (see map).

Tip of the Month

Did you know that teflor tape will substitute for water pump packing in an emergency? Start it on the shaft and touch the starter (remove coil wire) until it builds up to about 1/4 inch.






