
Thanks again to Jim Willet for an original cover. This looks like a scene out of Jim's childhood on the farm.



We will check the distributor cam for wear, and you may also want to install a new condenser and points. For starters we will check the brushes and springs, and the fields for shorts. You may want to install new brushes and bushings. We will also check the armature and turn if necessary and recut the mica. If someone has a growler to check the armatures with, please let me know. Note: Bring your own new parts.




