



The Board meeting was called to order by President Heiland at 7:41 PM on Feb. 27, 1986 at the Heilands' home. Present were Jon Heiland, Pieter Dwinger, Mike Humphries, Keith and Carol Justice, Lou Spielberger, Jerry Sterling, Les Nesbitt, and Dick and June Riha.

Treasurer Mike Humphries reported expenses of \$196 and income of \$423 for a net increase of \$227.

Leslie Nesbitt reported on the Date Festival Tour which was a good trip for the 10 Model A's attending. Coming activities include the Kite Fly on March 9, Pancake Breakfast on March 16 and the Yuma Tour on April 4, 5, and 6. (See Leslie's article for details.)

A discussion of speed on tours ended in agreement that, in general, the tour rules of 45mph are followed. (Special note for Model A owners: uphill is 40mph and downhill is 50, the average being 45.) The club has always had a few fast cars but the rule is 45mph.


Distributor editor reported the roster should be out in the next two weeks.

There was no new business. The next board meeting will be held at the Sterlings' on March 27 at 7:30 PM. The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 PM.




NESBITT'S RUNS by Leslie Nesbitt

This replaces the Gates #700, fits the "A" perfectly and is made in the U.S.A. Non sale price is only \$3.79 for those of you who can't wait.


BOWLING FANS




