Please bring your boxed and canned food donations for the Albert Sitton Home to the October and November meetings. Also, books and toys (to age 17) are needed.

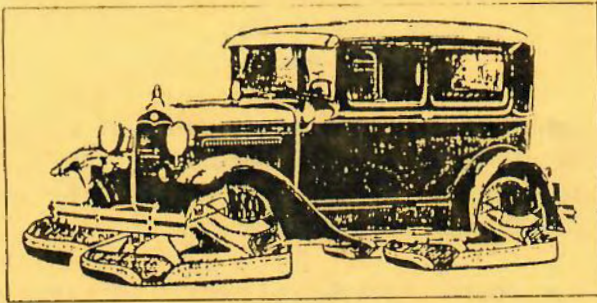

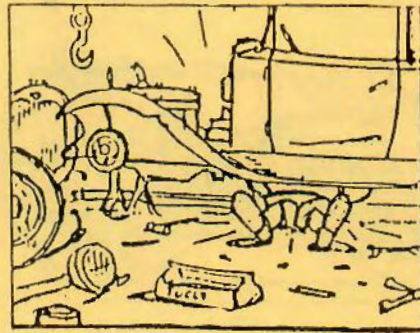
NESBITT'S RUNS

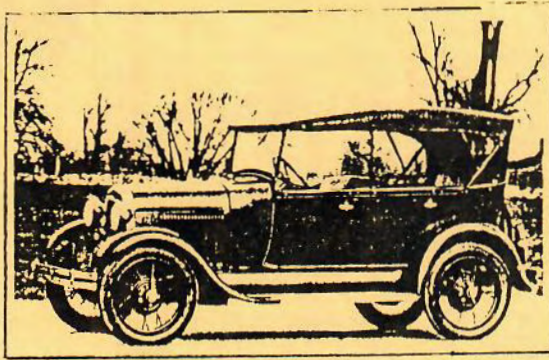


TECHNICAL TALK

BLENDER CHOCOLATE MOUSSE

(Equal, Sugar Substitute)

A quick chocolate dessert to satisfy and tempt a calorie-counter's cravings.

Makes four 1/2-cup servings at 40¢ each.

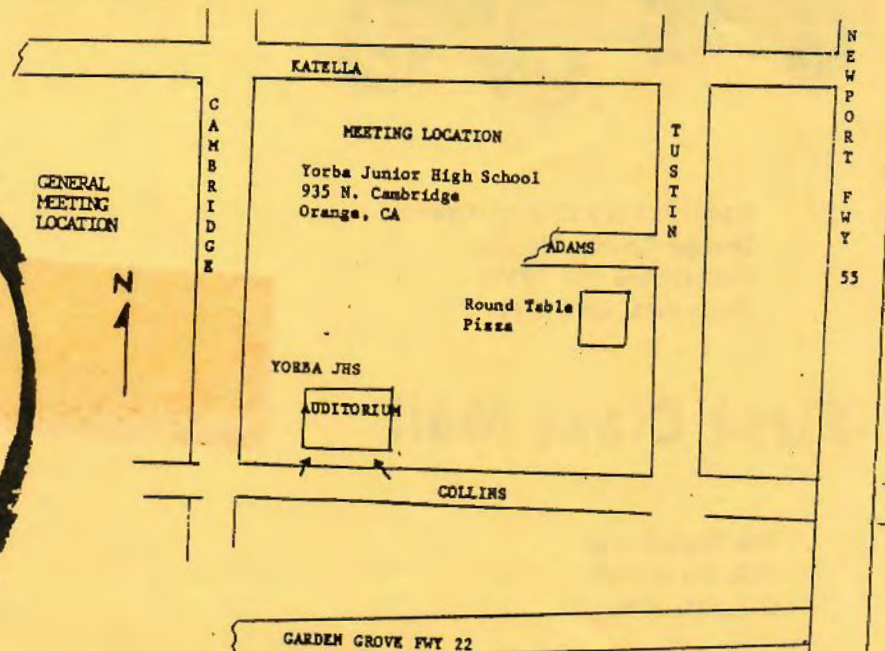
Nutrient Value Per Serving: 108 calories, 8 g protein, 4 g fat, 10 g carbohydrate, 156 mg sodium, 79 mg cholesterol.

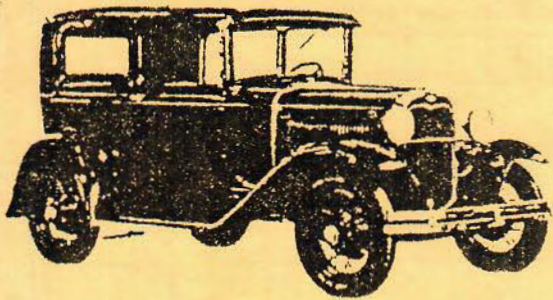
- 1 egg
- 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1 tablespoon cold water
- 1 cup boiling water
- 2 tablespoons instant coffee granules
- 1/2 cup part-skim ricotta cheese
- 1/2 cup skim milk, cold
- 2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- Sugar substitute equal to 18 teaspoons sugar

1. Combine egg, gelatin, cornstarch and cold water in blender or food processor. Blend to moisten gelatin and cornstarch.
2. Add boiling water. Blend until gelatin dissolves. Add instant coffee granules, ricotta cheese, skim milk, cocoa powder, salt and sugar substitute; blend until smooth.
3. Transfer to medium-size bowl. Refrigerate, covered, until set, about 2 to 3 hours.
4. To serve: Blend mixture until smooth (see Note) and pour into 4 dessert dishes. Serve immediately.

Note: Some blenders may not have a strong enough motor to blend this mixture. In this case, use a food processor or electric mixer on high speed.
