




TREASURER'S NOTE




and Bev Marsh. Model A's picked up at B1 Toro

Cheryl Conkol and few other names I didn't get.


Coming events in Sept!!



Tip of the month:

i) Ford used copper washers for the spark plugs to better effect heat transfer.

2) To get the perfect ground for your headlights use braded picture hanging wire. Solder to the side of the light socket and run the wire down thru the flex cable and connect to top bolt of the radiator to shell bolt.



ANGELS GAME by Les Nesbitt

We had an excellent turnout to watch the Angels beat the Oakland A's 6 to 4. That puts us 2 1/2 games ahead of our nearest rivals, the Texas Rangers in the American League West. Thre were some real highligts in the game: 1) Getting to see Reggie hit one of his famous home runs is always a thrill. Former Dodger Dusty Baker played first base for 2 or 3 innings, then was relieved by former Angel Bruce Bochte. Bruce as usual did an outstanding job and went 2 for 3 or 4. Another former Angel, Carney Lansford, played third base for the entire evening and was also on base 2 or 3 times.

Oakland's Rijo pitched a super game, going 8 innings before being relieved by Moneyham. Fortunately the usually awesome Kingman, designated hitter for Oakland, was not too awesome tonight. Nosebleed MAFCA's looked down on Tillman for about 3-4 innings, then he was relieved by Davis in right field for the remainder of the game. We were able to watch Rupert Jones in right

field for the Angels all evening.




