This is a 1931 AA Model A Ford Truck. The First owner was the Railway Express. It was used to haul freight at the rail vard. The truck came from the factory as a stake bed, with a 157 inch wheelbase. The second owner was (T.B.S.), "The Burbank Studios". They had the wheel base lengthened to 190 inches, and built this (1 of a kind) 20 passenger tour bus, which they used to tour people through the studio movie lots. It has an emergency exit door, electric exit signs, roof lights and brass assist handles, park type benches, removable acrylic windows. The body is all steel with wood trim. It was used in various movies, the last one in 1983 was the "The Barbara Graham Story", filmed in Mexico. The bus was retired in September of 1983 and became the home of a Doberman, 3 Wasp nests and many rats, there are nests in the head liner, under the seat on the manifold, front cross member etc. The top speed (so far) has been 38 mph. on a totally stock engine, with a 4 speed transmission and factory stock rear end. 




Miles of history
