

Thank you Glenn and Sharon Johnson for hosting the September technical seminar. Thank you Roger Sowersby for providing some of the tools and the know how to do the job.

The September seminar was another DO-IT seminar where we inspected and replaced the bushings in a couple sets of king pins. A dozen and a half Do-ers came to pound, hone and ream the new bushings into shape.

For Saturday October 10 we have a frame straightening seminar planned at the Ferazzi home. If you would like your frame straightened, bring a frame (just the frame) to the seminar. We've been discussing the possibility of using the club trailer to pick up several person's frames on Friday night or Saturday morning. If you need such transportation for your frame to the seminar, give me a call.

At the last general meeting some folks expressed an interest in steering boxes. The tentative plan is to have a general steering system seminar at the Dwinger home on Sunday Nov 15. We plan to adjust steering toe-in on the vehicles brought, adjust steering boxes and steering rods, and discuss the steering box internals.

THE RESTORER'S DICTIONARY

HEADLAMP (noun). An electric illumination device of which two are used on most cars, one to light the road and the other the tops of trees.


KIT (noun). A collection of miscellaneous parts which can be assembled in dozens of ways, none of which suit your car.


KNUCKLE (noun). The human joint from which blood is usually most easily obtained.


