
Our January seminar at Bob Ferrazi's house and garage was a big success. About 25 people attended and had a great time.



A TIP FROM LOU



When installing a new top on your Model A, it is a good idea to put an antenna for radio in at this time. Put a piece of copper window screen (approximately inches) between the padding and top material. Keep it about 3 inches from the metal body. Put masking tape on the edge to keep the raw edge from coming through the material. Solder a #18 gauge wire to the same and push down the corner pillar.

4 snap clothes pins
 14x14 piece of cardboard

This project goes quickly and you can make more than one. The will make a great Valentine gift.

I have also included below the Ladies Auxiliary Seminar for March in case you want to get the materials at the same time. This is also a NO SEW project.

For March, we will make a rag basket. This can be a small or large basket. The baskets can be used as a magazine holder, Easter basket, sewing basket, you name it, its up to you.

The materials needed are:

Small Basket

- 6 yds Craft Coiling (smallest diameter)
- 2. 1 yd fabric
- 3. Rip or cut in 2" wide strips
- 4. Large crochet hook

Large Basket

- 12 yds Craft Coiling (large diameter)
- 2. 2 yds fabric
- Rip or cut in 2" wide strips
- 4. Large crochet hook

The craft coiling can be purchased at the swap meet and at Penneys or any of the craft shops listed above. You can use scraps or buy new fabric. Four or more kinds of coordinating fabric look terrific.




