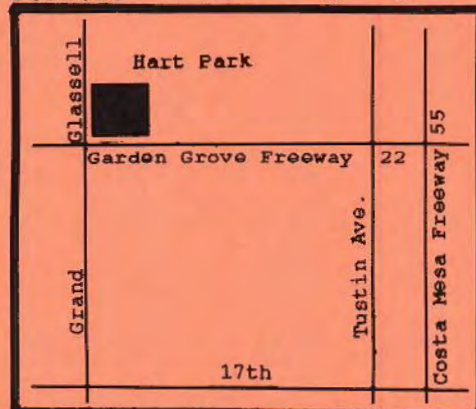

Martha reported that pancake droppers would cost about \$150. each. After much discussion, the board agreed that we should rent instead of purchase this item.

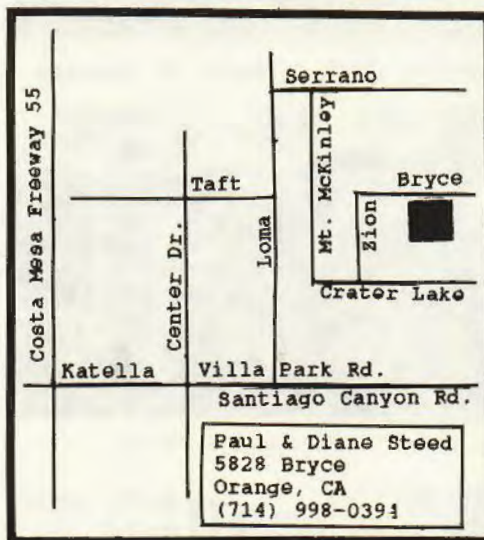

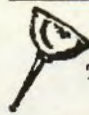
BOARD MEETING MAP

TECHNICALLY SPEAKING

There was no regularly scheduled technical seminar for July because of the convention activities. However, if you had an opportunity to visit the maintenance tent at the San Diego National Convention you could have participated in six days of the most diverse technical seminar of all times. The maintenance tent, under the direction of Larry McKinney, was intended to provide a place for convention attendees to maintain and repair their Model A's. Our job was to provide tools, equipment and technical expertise as required. Maintenance activities included everything from tire patching to rebuilding an overdrive. It was a lot of hard work but also a lot of fun.

The August seminar will cover rebuilding mechanical brakes. Glenn Johnson will demonstrate how to disassemble backing plates and inspect for wear and damage. Bring along your own backing plates and work along with us. The seminar will be hosted by the Ferazzi's on Friday, Aug 10 at 7:00 PM. A future seminar will cover the installation and adjustment of the rebuilt brakes parts on a car.

Handy Hints: The owner of a radiator shop, and former Model A'er recommends against the use of an ethylene glycol solution for your cooling system. The reason is that this coolant mixture tends to leak a great deal easier thru head gaskets, thru block and head cracks, and around stud threads than plain water. Instead, he suggests a mixture of water and a water pump lubricant (available at any auto

We learned at the maintenance tent that it is a good idea to have a hot patch kit for flat repairs, but remember to include some matches or a smoker in your tool box.

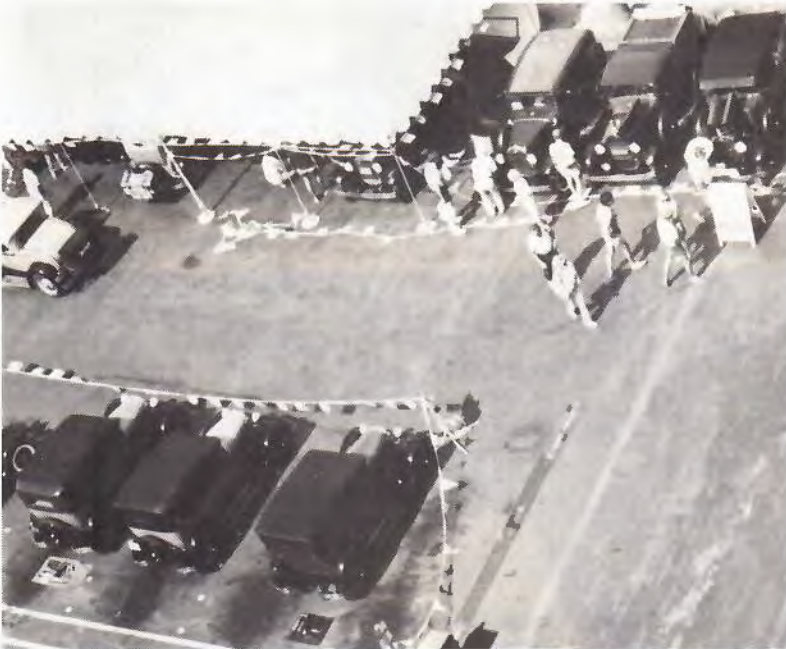

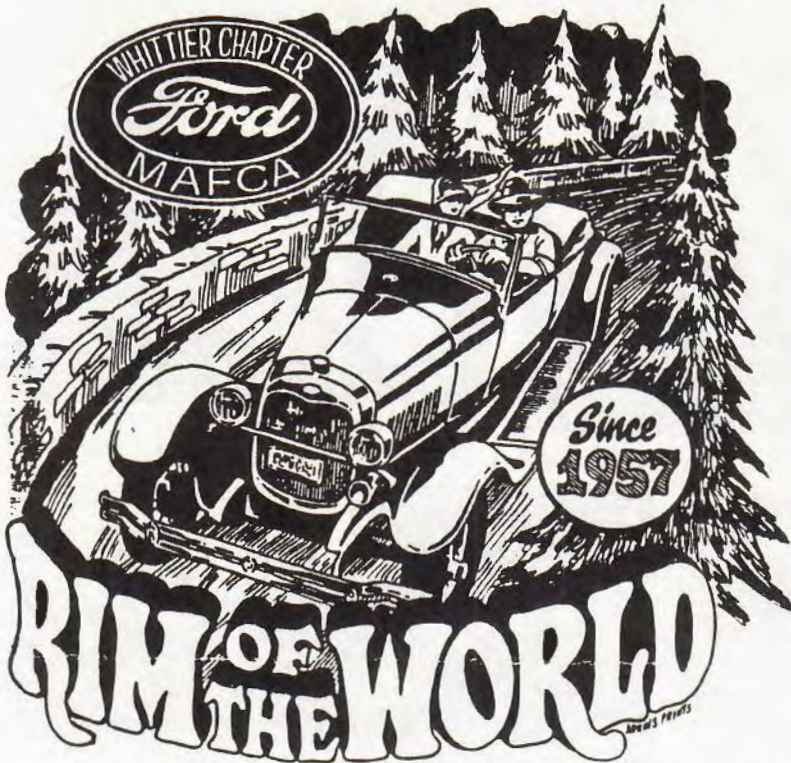

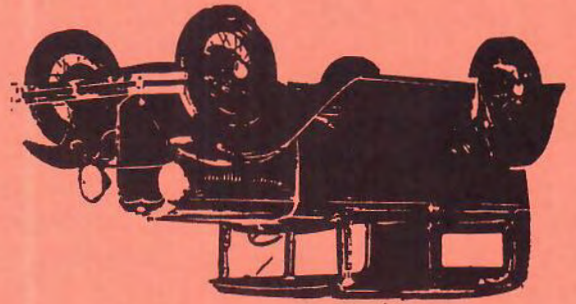
