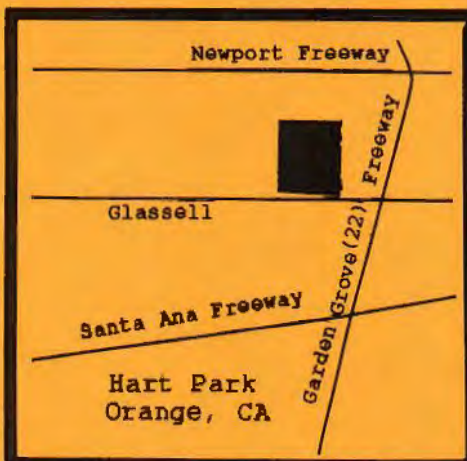

TECHNICALLY SPEAKING

We had a good turnout at the frame straightening seminar. We straightened eight frames, removed lots of rivets and replaced even more. A very special thanks to the Ferazzi's for being our hosts once again and thanks to those members who came by to help and kibitz.

We won't have a seminar in July because of the convention activities. Instead, let's give Larry McKinney lots of help in the maintenance tent. There should be plenty of technical things to do and to learn there.

HANDY HINT: Excessive play in the steering can be annoying, unsafe and downright fatiguing at times. The problem isn't always in the steering box. Before adjusting the steering box, check for loose kingpins, wheel bearings, tie rod and drag link ends, pitman arm where it mounts to the frame. Once you tighten these, then proceed with the necessary steering box adjustments. The procedures for adjusting both '28-'29 and '30-'31 steering systems are presented in the Model "A" Ford Service Bulletins and other publications. For the '28-'29 steering box, the only adjustments are eliminating sector shaft and worm gear end play. Don't get them too tight. For the '30-'31 steering system, the sector and worm gear mesh adjustment is usually all that is required. Be sure to fill the steering box with 600-W oil, not grease. STP is ok and a little grease on the sector shaft is ok and should serve to reduce leaks.

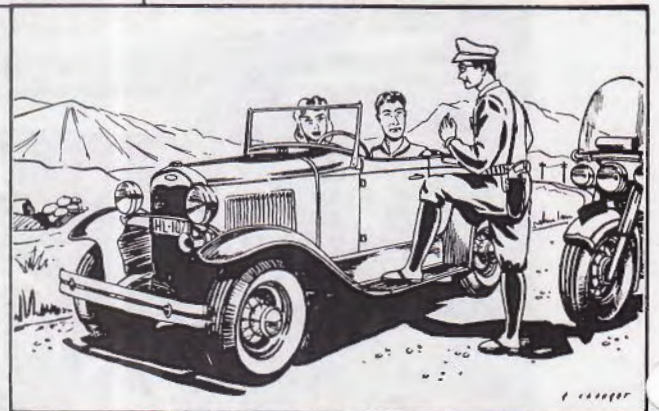

PARTS IS PARTS?

As we all go about our way driving and enjoying our Model A's we are constantly buying parts to improve and maintain them. I have noticed a great difference in the prices and quality of reproduction parts. In most cases, original parts seem to be the best replacement, but they are difficult to find and can be very expensive. This is not always the case however. If you invest the time to search swap meets, many times original parts are a lot less expensive. In the last 6 months I have found some tremendous bargains no N.O.S. and mint original parts.

Original parts are out there, but lets face it, the reproduction parts are the way that most of us keep our cars on the road. With this in mind we owe it to

ourselves and our cars to find the best value for our money. Because of the great difference in the quality of reproduction parts and because no one vendor carries the best parts at the lowest price, I have found and use six suppliers for my needs. They are: A&L of Canton, Conn., Bratton's of Gaithersburg, MD, C.W. Moss of Orange, CA, Gaslight of Urbana, Ohio, Snyder's of New Springfields, Ohio, and Vintage Ford Parts of Stanton, CA.

All of these suppliers have treated me fairly and have handled returns for any reason with prompt payment and courtesy. I tend to favor our local suppliers because they support our club through donations and they are close to home. I do however suggest that out of state suppliers be considered because they offer, in some instances, much higher quality parts and much lower prices. Out of state suppliers do charge

freight, but they don't charge tax, it about washes. Most offer 800 phone numbers or accept collect calls. Orders can be placed on a credit card and are generally shipped and received in 3-5 days. I like it because it saves me a trip to the store and a phone call on Monday puts the parts on my front porch by Friday.

For the sake of comparison, I have listed 36 commonly ordered parts with suppliers and prices. I have tried to select fairly generic parts, but in some cases there are some great differences in the quality i.e. '29 hup caps & gas shut off valve. I used current price lists from each supplier. Look it over and compare. In most cases it pays to shop around. Happy shopping!

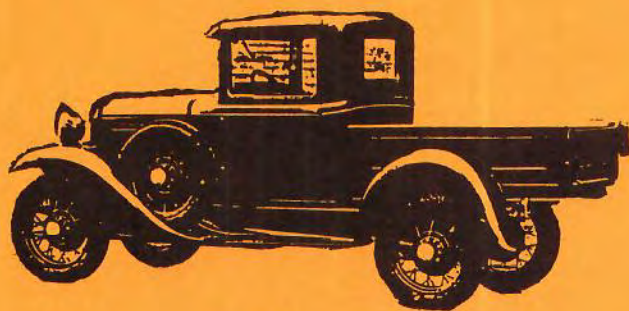
