



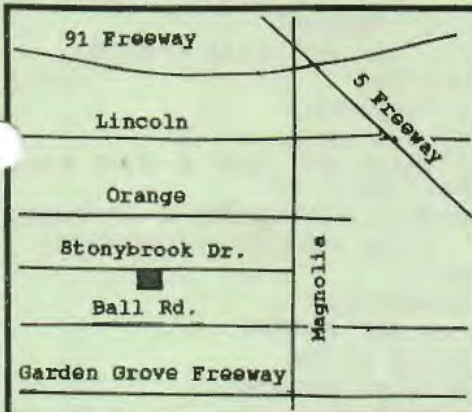

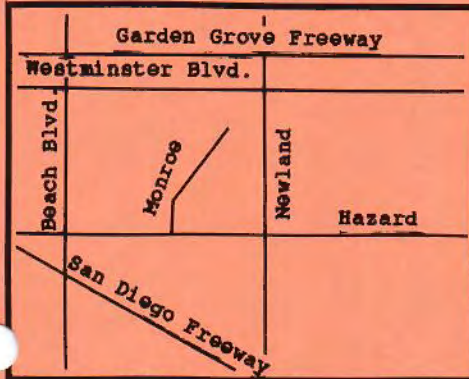

BOARD MEETING

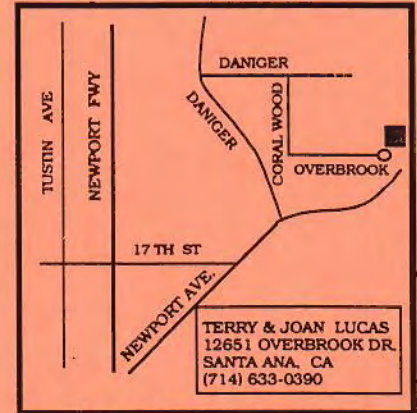

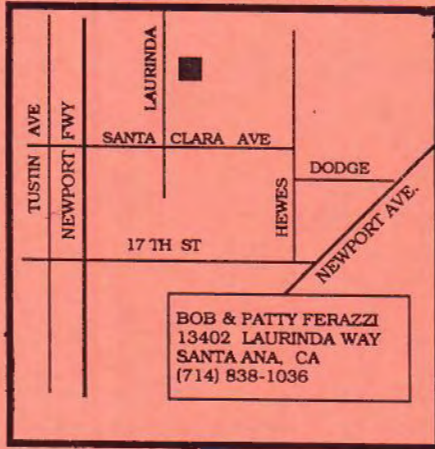
Thanks to Bob and Patty Ferazzi for hosting our May seminar. A special thanks to Dennis Griffin for pulling together an excellent carburetor presentation with so little advance notice. And thanks to all those who brought carburetors and manifolds to add to the presentation.

If you're doing a frame-up restoration of a Model A, you should begin by straightening the frame. After sixty years of bouncing around all kinds of roads, the underdesigned Model A frames tend to sag. Frames must be straightened so that body components fit properly.

As you probably have guessed by now, the June seminar will be on frame straightening. Frames must be bare, i.e., body components, engine and running gear must be removed. We will also tighten and replace rivets. The seminar will be held on Saturday, June 16th at 9AM at the Ferazzi's. Anyone needing transportation for their frame call me at work at 896-3833 or at home at 832-8239.

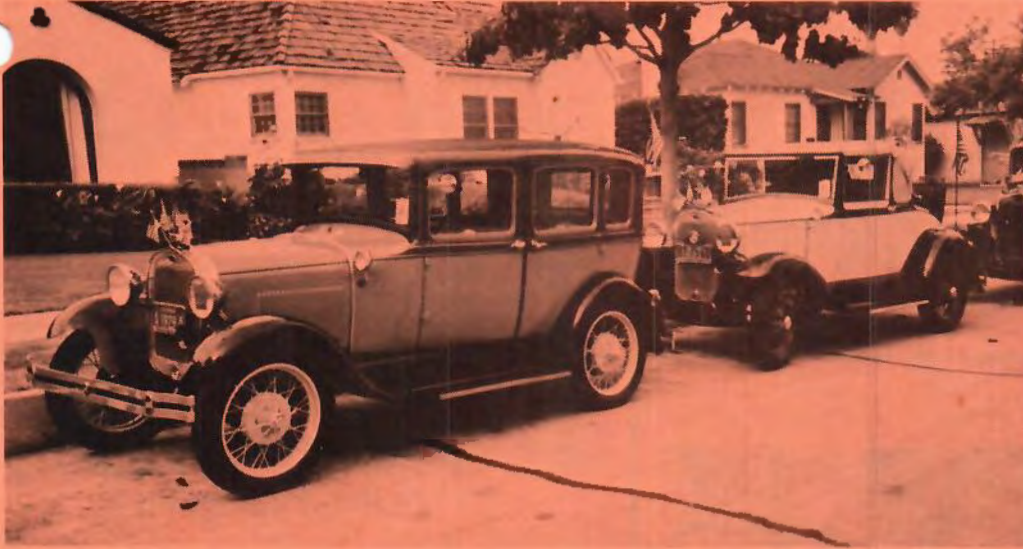
