




Paul has informed us that the Beach Party on August 19 will be held at Doheny State Beach, not Capistrano Beach as stated in Secretary's report.

## TECHNICALLY SPEAKING

By Don Tune Technical Advisor

The April seminar on transmissions was excellent. Thanks to Jon Heiland for a very informative presentation and thanks to Bob and Patty Ferazzi for being our hosts.

The May seminar will be on carburetors. We will begin with a display and historical presentation covering Model A and B carburetors, including after-market carburetors and intake manifolds. This is an invitation to all to bring interesting and informative things. We will then move on to rebuilding carburetors.

Carburetor air leaks can cause some perplexing problems, particularly at idle speeds. If you find that your idle air adjustment has little or no effect and that your engine stalls when you come to a stop, it may be an air leak. A common place for a leak is around the throttle shaft at the lever end. I have a fixture to align and drill out worn A and B carburetor bearings. We can then insert bushings to seal the leaks.


If you're aware of the misalignment between the choke rod and adjustment needle driver. Some people enlarge or elongate the carburetor mounting holes

on the intake manifold to allow the carburetor to rotate into position. If you don't want to do this, the mounting bolts can be modified to correct the problem. Come see how this is done.

The carburetor seminar will be held at the Ferazzi's. See you there at 7:30, Friday, May 11.





A Lines

No. 5453. Side panels, cut to give a slender effect at the hips and to flare at the hem, are attached in a pointed line. Size 16 requires 3¼ yards of 40inch material

No. 5461, A slender frock with a flaring dipping hemline is ac-companied by a flaring short sloeved jacket. Size 36 requires 5 yards of 36-inch lace, contrasting, ½ yard of 40-inch material.

> No. 5458. A bouffant skirt that dips in long points is combined with a fitted bodice finished with a handkerchief collar. Size 16 requires 3% yards of 36-inch ma-terial; collar, % yard of 40-inch.

No. 5471. A side drapery falling in a long point below the hem is a new fashion feature of a formal evening gown. Size 36 requires 3 yards of 36-inch or 40-inch material.


