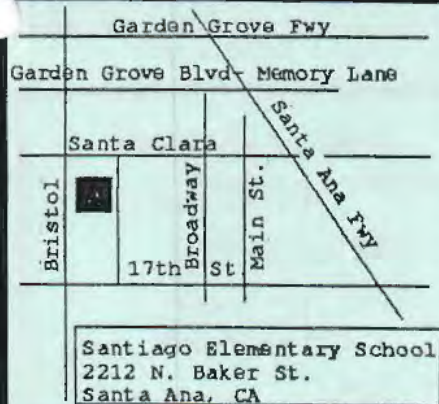

CHEVROLET GREAT RACE WEST

Sunday October 28th the Chevrolet Greatrace West ended it's run at the Queen Mary in Long Beach. Among the racers was our own Piet Dwinger. Piet was driving his 1929 Briggs Town Sedan along with his navigator Phil Hurwitz.

Piet & Phil ran this race as practice for the upcoming Great Race scheduled for the end of June. They had some excellent times for beginners, their best time on one leg of the day was only 9 seconds off of a perfect score. They were only 16 seconds off on another leg and on one day only 19 seconds off of a perfect score for a leg. All in all, 60% of the

daily legs were no more than 1 minute off with scores of 29, 35, and 45 seconds off.

Piet said that the Model "A" ran great although a wire came off the distributor 1 1/2 miles from the last check point on day two, which until then was a great day. The last day, on the Tehachapi loop, the fuel pump gave out on them it took only 21 seconds to switch to the backup pump. They did although, managed to travel the 1000 miles mostly trouble free.

Piet also said, that the weather was great and that they learned a lot about Great Racing. They now have 8 months to get ready for

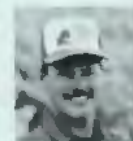

the cross country Great Race, which will run 13 days and carry them across 4500 miles.

I understand that a few of our club members will be assisting Piet in the upcoming race as pit crew. Steve Balmer worked with Piet several days & nights to help Piet get the car ready for this race. The members of the pit crew will be: Steve Balmer, Larry McKinney, and Bob Ferazzi.

Piet was not the first of our club members to participate in these races though. Cal Woolsey raced in the 1988 Great Race, the 1988 Chevrolet GreatRace West warmup, in which he broke a timing gear, in the 1985 Great Race in a '31 Pontiac, and in 1984 as a Crew Chief.

In the 1988 championship run from Disneyland to Boston, he finished 19th out of 120 entries. Cal and his navigator Tom Kucera placed in the 15th position when it came to their accumulative time overall. Cal told me that the 1988 run was the longest Great Race ever with a total of 4500 miles.

It is our understanding that the 1991 Great Race will again match this distance record. It looks as though Piet and Phil have their work cut out for them this next year with such a long race to drive in. We wish them both well and will be there to cheer for them.

BOARD MEETING

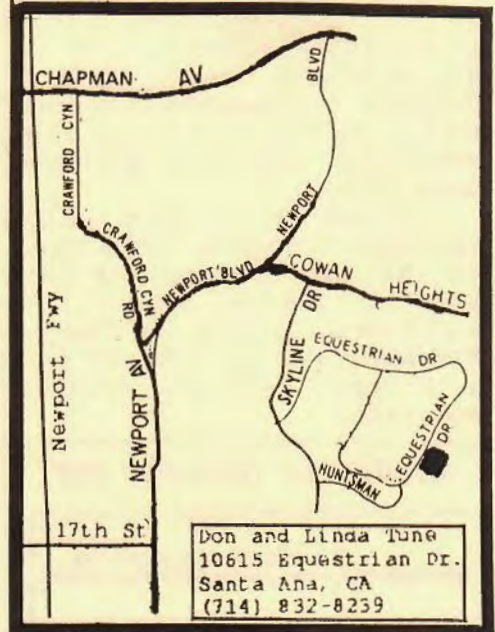

NEW LAW

Legislation bill (AB2912) implementation will begin November 1, 1990. The changes are as follows: You are now required to inform the DMV whether or not you will use the vehicle(s) you own. Late registration penalties have been doubled. Both vessels and trailer coaches must maintain current registration at all times whether in use or not. Each vehicle must either be registered or have

non-operational status on record with the DMV at all times. You must either pay full registration and vehicle license fee to place registered status on your vehicles. Or pay a \$5 non-operational status filing fee to place non-operational status on your vehicle. During implementation, beginning Nov. 1, 1990, expiration dates, past due fees, and penalties may be waived if you can certify that the vehicle was not operational for any previous full registration year for which registration fees were not paid. It is critical for non-operational status to be received or postmarked on or before the expiration date.

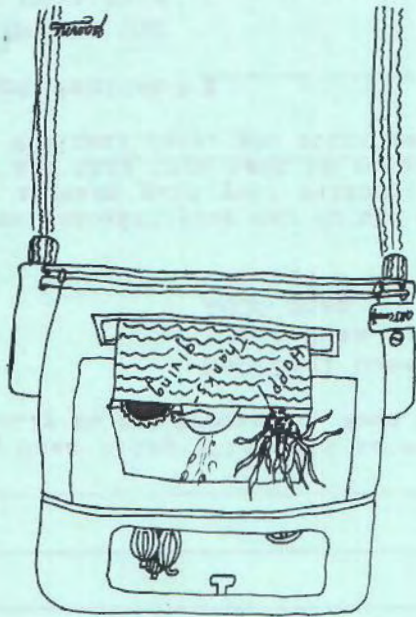

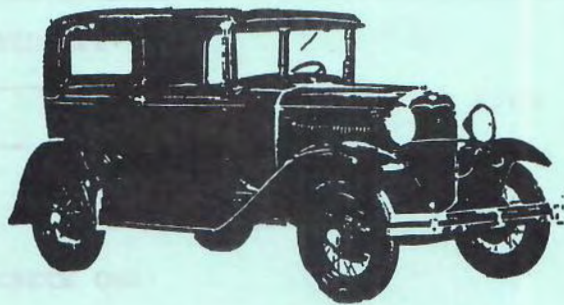
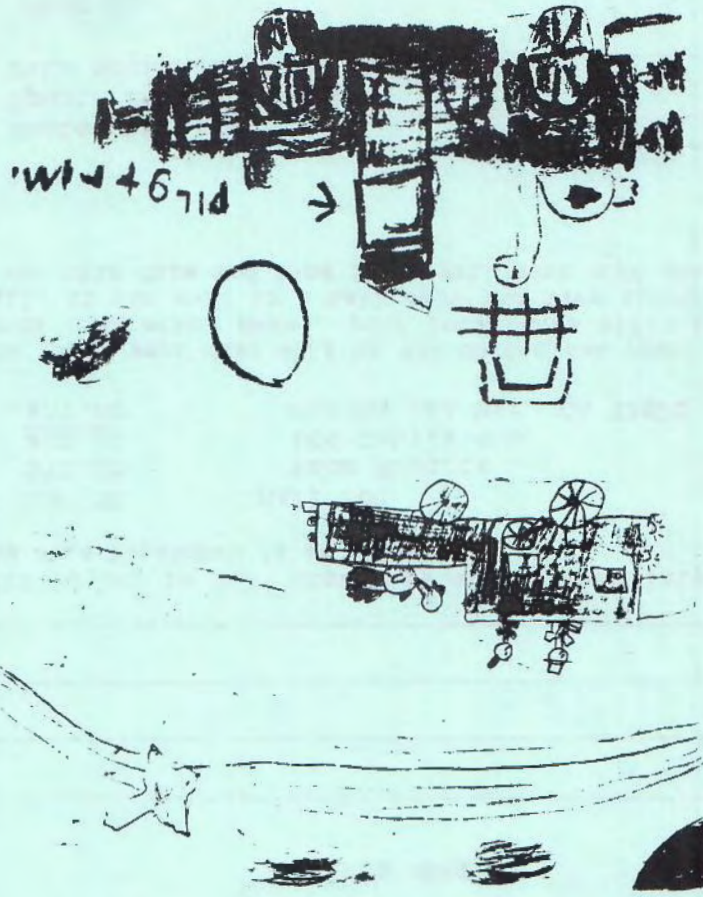
