

We found out that there were a couple of Model A Clubs around and were told we had to have 25 members to get a Charter. That was in 1959

that we started to look for members. We later found out after a year and a half of trying to get members that we only had to have 5 members to form the Charter. Which we finally did get on August 11, 1961, with 25 members.

We started meeting at each others houses, Jack Fisher Park, at the Snack Shop at 17th & Flower, & at Copper Penny in Santa Ana, we just met wherever we could

find a large room.
Finally the Club really started growing, at that time you might say, it was strictly just a man's club, to start off with. Later on then the women got active and had cake bakes, cookie bakes, swap meets, and events to raise money for the club. We just kept growing and growing (CONTINUED PAGE 4)

Again "Happy Anniversary".


MODEL "A" WORKBENCH

and growing.

The first president was Erve Korn in 1961. The next President only lasted a few months then Bill Vaughn took over as President in 1962. In 1963 Joe Eatherton was President. In 1964 Bill Vaughn was President.

We use to meet at each other houses back then at the time we only had 8 or members then so it wasn't too big of a croud. The wives would take care of the refreshments, we would have our meeting & try to make out some kind of program as far as events & things & then we started electing officers.

Finally we move to Izaak Walton Clubhouse, in Santa Ana, we were there 13 or 14 years. Then when it got to small for us, we moved into Yorba Jr. High School and we held our meetings there.

The Orange County Follies were correographed by Sandy Annatochi and were presented at many Model A events. The men were dressed as women, the women were dressed in era clothing & we would mime songs & dance to the old 1930 tunes. Most of what went on in the O.C. Follies are not printable.

What was the first dash plaque that was awarded by the Orange County Chapter? It was a ribbon and there aren't too many of them around.

We use to have orange fender flags, which read Orange County Model A Ford Club, which were clipped to the fender with a bracket. We would put them on the cars everytime we went to a parade or gynkhana.

We use to invite all the Chapters to each other's main events. Thats one way the Roundup got started too. In the late 60's when we all got together the Presidents & Activities Chairman of each Chapter we chose our event date & month so we wouldn't be interfering with each other's events. The Roundup was always the 3rd Saturday in October. None of the other Chapters would have anything else going that day because they wanted to participate in our event. It worked out real well for a long long time. Each club really stuck to the

date that they chose so that | the other chapters wouldn't draw participants from the event they had chosen that month. We did the same thing with the events of the other clubs and everybody participated.

One year at the Roundup Knotts it rained & we had over 100 people lined up to register. We had to close down while it rained hard, everyone sat waiting in their cars, only one person left.

We use to have a parade through Knotts and there was a time when the Roundup was actually inside Knotts. The judges were not to open doors or raise hoods, it was just on the appearence of cars & the costume. It was then later changed to include the inside of the cars.

In the earlier days when the club went to Yuma, Bakersfield, Lake Cachuma and all the different places we use to go, we would play practical jokes.

Down in Yuma, it was not the policy, but it always happened each year, the President got thrown in the pool clothes and all.

The campout at Lake Cachuma put on by the La Questa Chapter, one time when we met out there, there were 47 of us, including the kids, & 9 dogs all total. At this campout we managed to consume 11 gallons of vodka & orange juice around the campfire.

They had Gynkhanas and awards, little prizes & trophies for the events. It was just a good weekend tour & everyone had a good time as we did on all our campouts.

A little later on, maybe or 3 years down the road, Orange County was really known as about the most active in Southern California and a lot of the chapters thought, well, that's that roudy bunch from Orange County

Within our own chapter in Bakersfield we took one of the guys pickups & moved it down by the Marsh's room. The guy had the Sheriff & the helicopter up looking for that pickup and all we did was push it down & park along side by Jim & Bev Marsh's room. As it was being pushed (CONTINUED NEXT COLUMN)

The next morning when we got up to go to breakfast Ray & Jean said well here's our car. Ray got in to start it & when he let out the clutch his mouth dropped about a foot, because he didn't go anywhere. Jean happened to be on the right hand side of the car & asked Ray, Honey how come the rear wheel is turning? Well then he found out what it was.

In Yuma one time Jim & I had rooms down there. His daughter was to come down & she didn't make it. She had a refrigerator in her room so Jim & I just picked it up moved that apartment sized refrigerator down into our room where the party was.

In 1974 we were aboard the Queen Mary, Al Pepperton of Bakersfield was down & he was a real good friend of ours. We were trying to take the louvers off the outside door so we could get into their room. John Hyland was standing watch for us & we \$ found out we couldn't get inside. We could hear Al's wife just laughing like mad. So we were putting the louvers back on & John took off, here one of the roaving guards caught Jim Douglas & I and asked what we were doing. 

1 c. raisins

Dressing:

3/4 c. mayonnaise 1/3 c. sugar 1 1/2 Tbls vinegar

Don't cook, just add & refrigerate. (If salad seems dry, just add more dressing.
