



The meeting was called to order by the President, Paul Steed, at 7:35 p.m. in the Wavra's residence, Costa Mesa, CA. All Board members were present.

1. Secretary - The previous Board minutes, prepared by former Secretary Terry Lucas, were read, amended; then accepted by the Board.

2. Treasurer - The Treasurer indicated the Club's accounting records for FY 1989/90 are ready for audit. An Audit Committee was formed to review the records on February 9th, 1991. The Treasurer and Editor have been in close communication regarding collecting Club dues. Several methods of encouraging members to pay their dues on time were discussed. It was decided that Buttons would again be made for the annual Pancake Breakfast. Approximately 600 buttons will be made. Jim Marsh and Don Tune will design and prepare the artwork for the buttons and Red Kiser will be responsible for assembling them. The materials will be provided as soon as possible so that this long and tedious task can be completed prior to the March 10th deadline.

Joe Wavra indicated he had 6 people signed up to use their cars for the upcoming Pacific Auto Parts Show to be held in the Anaheim Convention Center, February 5th, 6th, and 7th.

4. Editor - Martha stated that the next issue of the Distributor was progressing satisfactorily. It was noted that several members did not receive their copy of the Distributor until as late as January 16th (postmarked January 8th.) there was an apparent "foul-up" by the Post Office in delivering them. To help prevent this from recurring, several suggestions were discussed. After specific requirements have been determined, "Stanchions" will be scheduled as the next Technical Seminar.


