

INTERESTING FORD INFORMATION (Taken from the June/August Ford Service Bulletin, pgs. 16 & 44.) SPARK PLUGS -Spark plug gaps have a pronounced effect on engine performance. The following gap sizes are recommended: '32, '33 Mod. "B" & "C" / .030" gap / B-6050 cy. head / 90 lb. compression. Mod "A" .035" gap / A-6050-A cy. head / 75 lb. compression /

Mod. "A" w/High Comp. Head .025" gap / A-6050-B cy. head / 110 lb. compression /

P. S. - If your horn doesn't need repair, come on over anyway and do some "bench racing".

MAY THE NEW YEAR BRING EACH OF YOU MUCH HAPPINESS AND PROSPERITY.






