



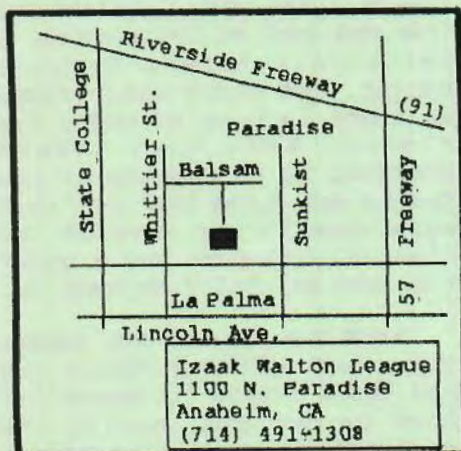

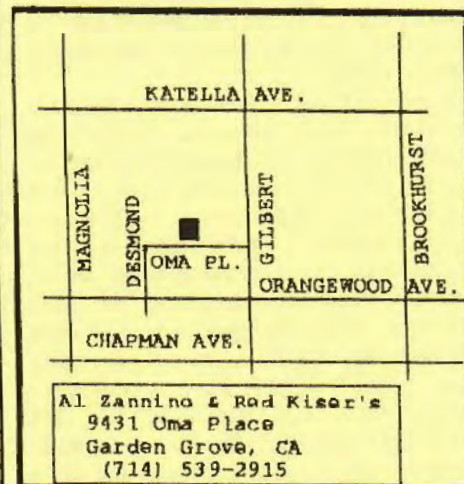
learn something and also become involved.

Anybody having Club Tools in their possession we need to know if you have them or have passed them on to another member. If you have a tool and are not using them please return them to Al Zannino. If you are still using a tool please contact me, Al, to let me know you still have the tool and are still using it. Al (714) 539-2915.

Handy Hint: Some people use Armor All or similar products on their tires and vinyl tops. These products are OK for vinyl but I'm told that they accelerate the deterioration of tires and turn white sidewalls yellow. Try tincture of green soap on your tires instead (I don't know about white sidewalls). Green soap is a disinfecting soap and has long been used as a lubricant and protectorant of rubber products. It will give your tires a semi-glossy look. Just wipe it on and let it dry. Also, use it when mounting tires rather than household soap which tends to be corrosive. It can be purchased in any drug store.

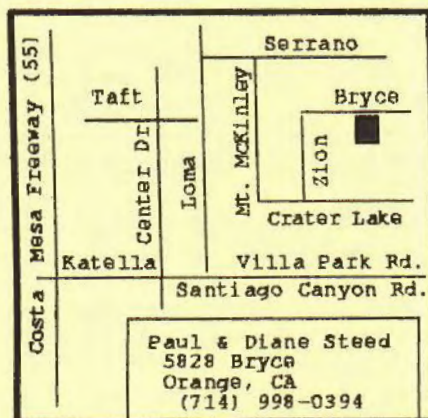
Shows have been scheduled to date.

In case you missed it, in his letter to The Restorer, Rod Schweiger brought up some interesting bits of news: Our Governor has proposed a restructuring of the auto registration fees. The registration of a new car now costs about \$300 per year declining to \$27 for a 10 to 12 year old car. He is proposing to make the registration fee of all cars the same. You can bet that it would be near the current maximum. Also, Rod stated that using the license plate of one car on another is a felony in this

ON PARTS

If you drive your Model A, it is essential to carry extra parts. Listed are recommended parts to carry:

PARTS TO ALWAYS HAVE WITH YOU

Ignition points	condenser (2)
Distributor body, cap, rotor	generator cutout
water pump packing, hose, clamp	fan belt
head & tail light bulbs	misc. nuts, bolts, cotter pins
flashlight	electrical tape
tool kit, pliers	lug wrench
wrenches	jack
screwdrivers	crank
socket set	some bailing & electrical wire

PARTS TO CARRY ON LONG TRIPS

extra distributor	carburetor
water pump & fan	generator & coil
lug nuts & sparkplugs	water pump chassis grease
timing gear	full engine gasket set
tire pump and patch kit	extra tire tube
water	oil

Be on time, have a full tank of gas, and be ready to go!!

These items are just a suggestion, I'm sure everyone will add to it, but you shouldn't head out on a trip alone with less than this.

When touring with a group your tour kit doesn't have to be as complete, it's not really necessary for everyone to carry all of the heavy stuff like a generator.

If you're alone and don't know "How To", your kit should include a good "How To Book" that could help get you back on the road if you have the parts for the repair. Happy Touring Larry

TORQUE MEASUREMENTS (GIVEN IN FOOT-POUNDS)

This is a guideline for torquing different fasteners. Keep in mind that when original fasteners are used their tension loss is unknown, due to the number of times they have been reused. For this reason the torque measurement might need to be adjusted. It is best to use all new fasteners. Refer to the "Nuts and Bolts" article in "How to Restore your Model A, volume #3.

main bearing cap bolts	70 - 80

head	50 - 55
Torque the head in 3 stages, using the correct sequence.
