I would also like to mention that Atlantic Pacific, the transport company in our classified section is owned by club members, Jon & Brenda Evans. They also offer emergency tow service.


MODEL "A" WORKBENCH


Bev Marsh announced a baby shower for Annette Kelley that will be published in The Distributor.

When our state enacted a bill which established new laws regarding auto registration and established severe penalties for non-compliance, the perception of many of us was that the ACCC was asleep at the switch. However, a new bill has been introduced (AB 1947 by Eaves) which proposes to undo the features of AB 2912 which effect our hobby, This bill would delete the application for the certification of non-operation requirements for specified historical vehicles, antique motorcycles, street rods and other specified vehicles and would instead reinstate provisions permitting the filing of a certificate of non-operation in conjunction with an application to register any of these vehicles. This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statue. We'll have to follow this one closely. Some of our members have expressed an interest to attend ACCC meetings. I will be announcing the time and place for upcoming meetings.
