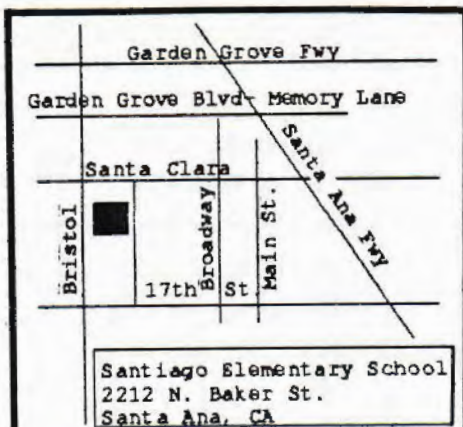

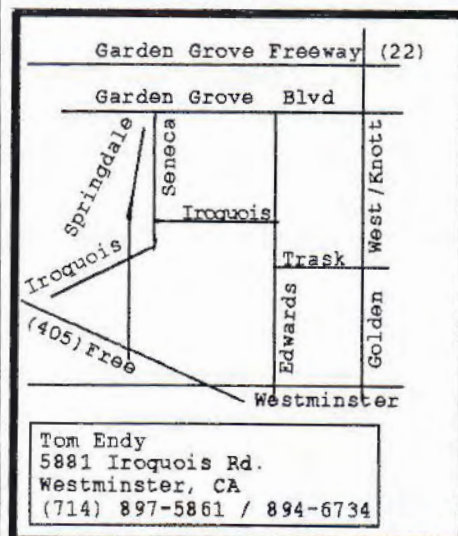

General Election. Several names were mentioned, however, Paul indicated he would contact these people and try to come up with a name to fill the post.

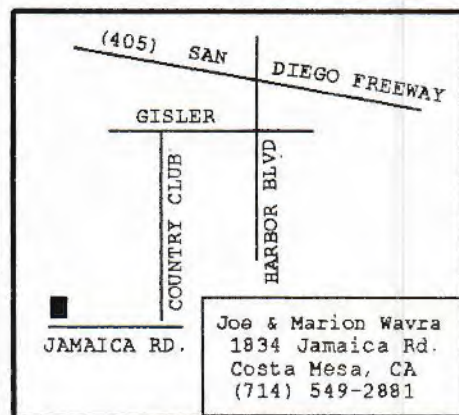

Chapter Bulletin

The new Paint Chip Book will be available at the swap meet at Hershey, or you can order it from the National in October. The price is \$18. plus \$3. postage. This book will be very valuable when you get ready to paint your Model A, & as a research book to varify colors & their combinations.

Rosters:

Will be printed & available May 1st. This means your dues MUST be at the National Headquarters before Jan 1st. If your chapter collects your dues, be sure these are sent in as soon as possible, and before January 1st. The Chapter list of meeting times & places, will also be published in this Roster.

1991 Ballots:

In addition to voting for your 1992-3 Board members there is a by-law amendment for you to vote on. If this By-law change passes, starting next year, all future NEW memberships will go into effect the month they join & their membership dues will go into effect the month they join & their membership dues will be annually in the same month they joined. 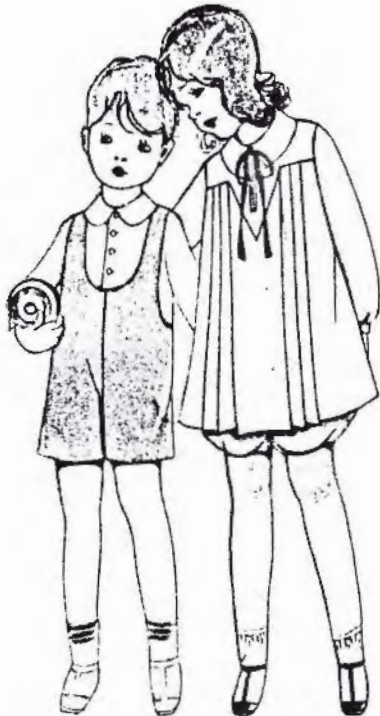

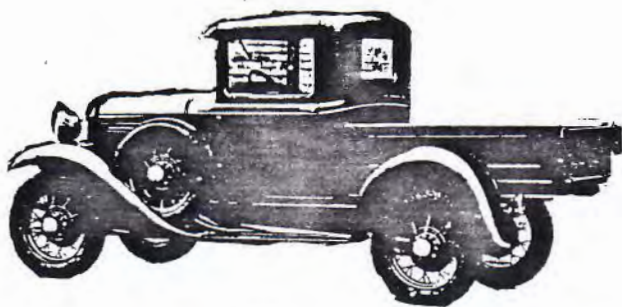
