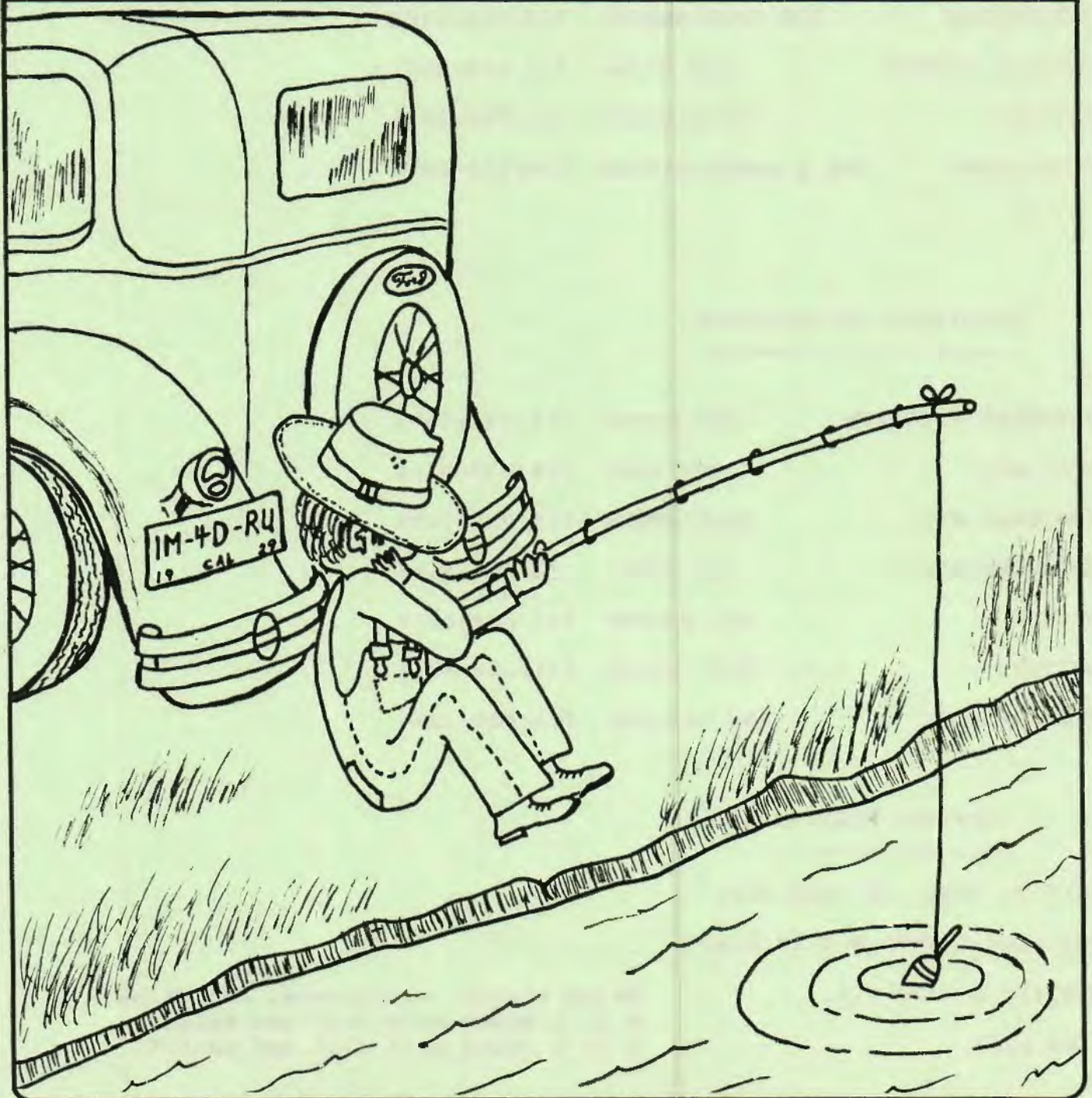

Participation in the Heritage Square celebration to be held August 22 & 23 was discussed. They need as many cars as possible for either day or both days.

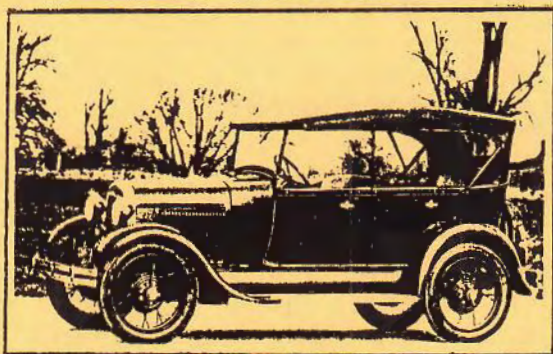
The August General meeting will again be held in Hart Park, bring "Potluck". The September meeting will be back at the school. The September board meeting will be at Peggy Bloom's house.

ACTIVITIES BY LOU



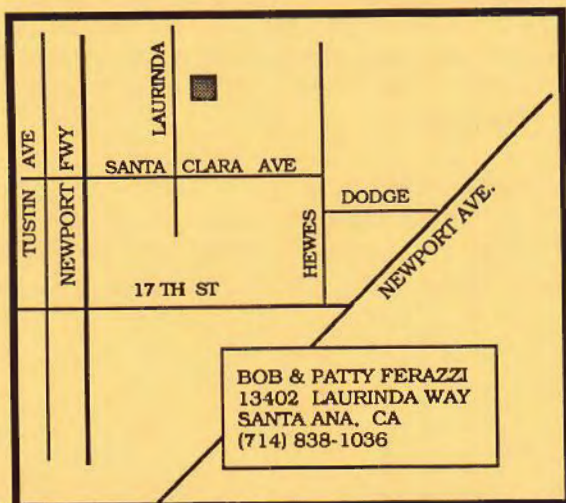
