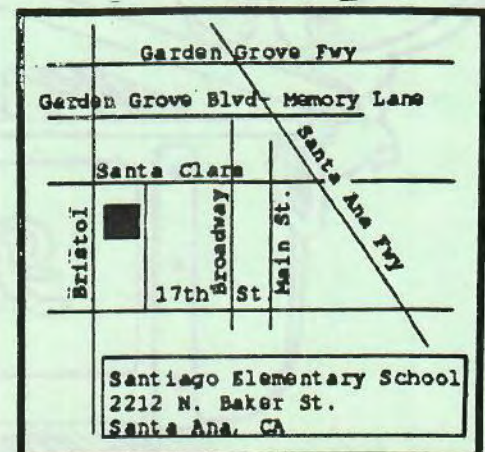

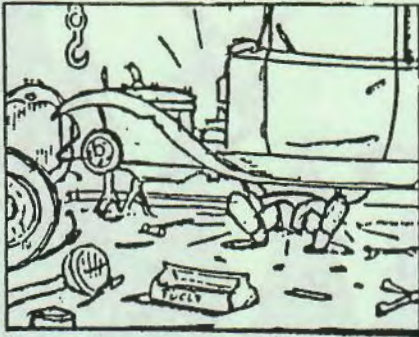

Well, Christmas is almost upon us and the year is almost done. I would like to take this time to thank all of you for all of your support and help in making the technical seminars informative and interesting.

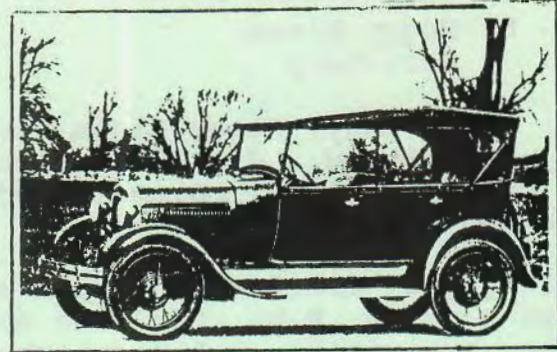

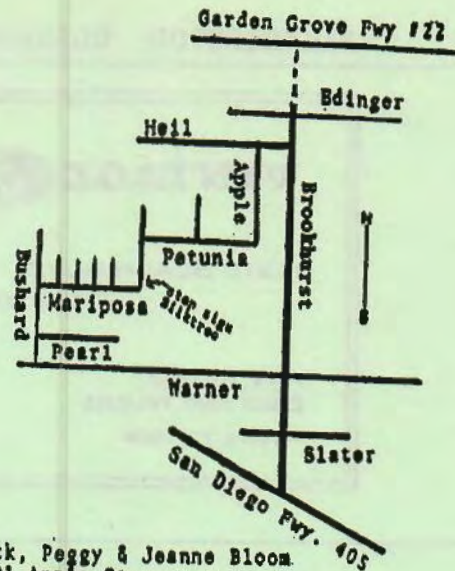

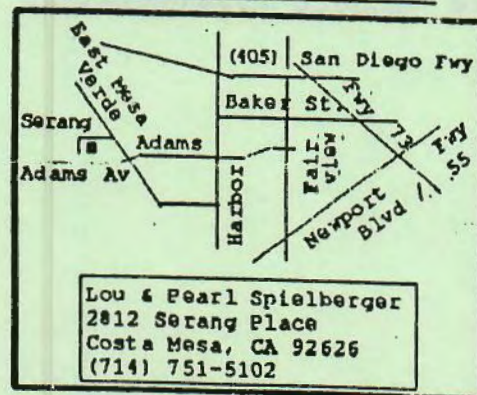


CAROLING AND LIGHTS

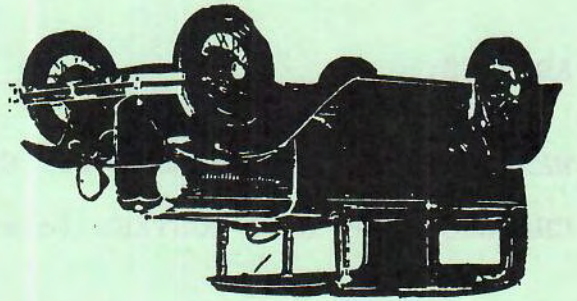
