


Joe needs 13 more cars for Old World on June 7th. Bring drip pans or cardboard.


The Whittier Narrows Funday is on again June 14th. Leave the Mall of Orange at 8:00 AM.

POMONA FRIENDS


(Taken from an article in the May issue of CRANK & ROD, the Pomona AFCA Club newsletter)

So mark your calendar, dust off your Model A and plan to be part of the fun.


