





At this time no pre-meetings for the Gold Country or Dallas tours are planned. Joe Wavra discussed Old World and Fun Day.





On the last leg of the trip home from Laughlin I noticed a different exhaust sound in my deluxe delivery. I assumed that the copper/asbestos gasket betwon the manifold and the exhaust pipe ad begun to leak and needed changing. It was raining hard as we pulled into the driveway and into my garage. I wiped the rain drops off, blew out all the moisture with my air hose and soon forgot about the small exhaust leak.

A couple of weeks later, the night of the April general meeting, I started the engine and was instantly reminded of the exhaust leak but decided to. drive to the meeting anyway. The leak got a little louder on the way letting me know that repair would have to be made soon. After the meeting we headed home up Main St. to Fwy 5 and North to the 57, all the time seeing a couple of "close together" headlights in my rear view mirror. The exhaust leak was getting louder and louder and suddenly at Katella Ave. while driving about 60 MPH in overdrive at 10:30 PM the exhaust pipe fell off making a lot of noise & clatter as it bounced along the roadway below. We checked the problem and found one of the manifold nuts was gone. I decided the simplest solution was to disconnect the muffler completely and drive home making noise. Roger provided a blanket for me to lay on while I removed the cotter pin, nut, & bolt and dragged the hot muffler out from under the car. We wrapped the muffler in Rogers blanket & he offered to carry it home in his rumble seat. We got back in our cars to leave but mine was dead. I had good lights & horn but the starter wouldn't crank. Roger to the rescue went back to his car and came back with his crank. I got in and Roger cranked. The engine roared to life and we were on our way. It was a noisy ride but we made it home okay. The next evening at the technical meeting they had the Hard Luck Trophy waiting for me. I accepted the trophy but as I look back on : situation my luck was really great. Roger Aday was there. Thanks again Roger.






