


HARD LUCK TROPHY




The Progressive Dinner was quite a success with over 20 Model A's on tour. There were many cheerful people and lots of food.

I understand the Reagan Library has many things to see and do. This will be mostly a freeway tour.


At Placentia Heritage Days we will be in the parade and in the afternoon we will be in the car show.

If you have any suggestions for future seminars please let me know.






