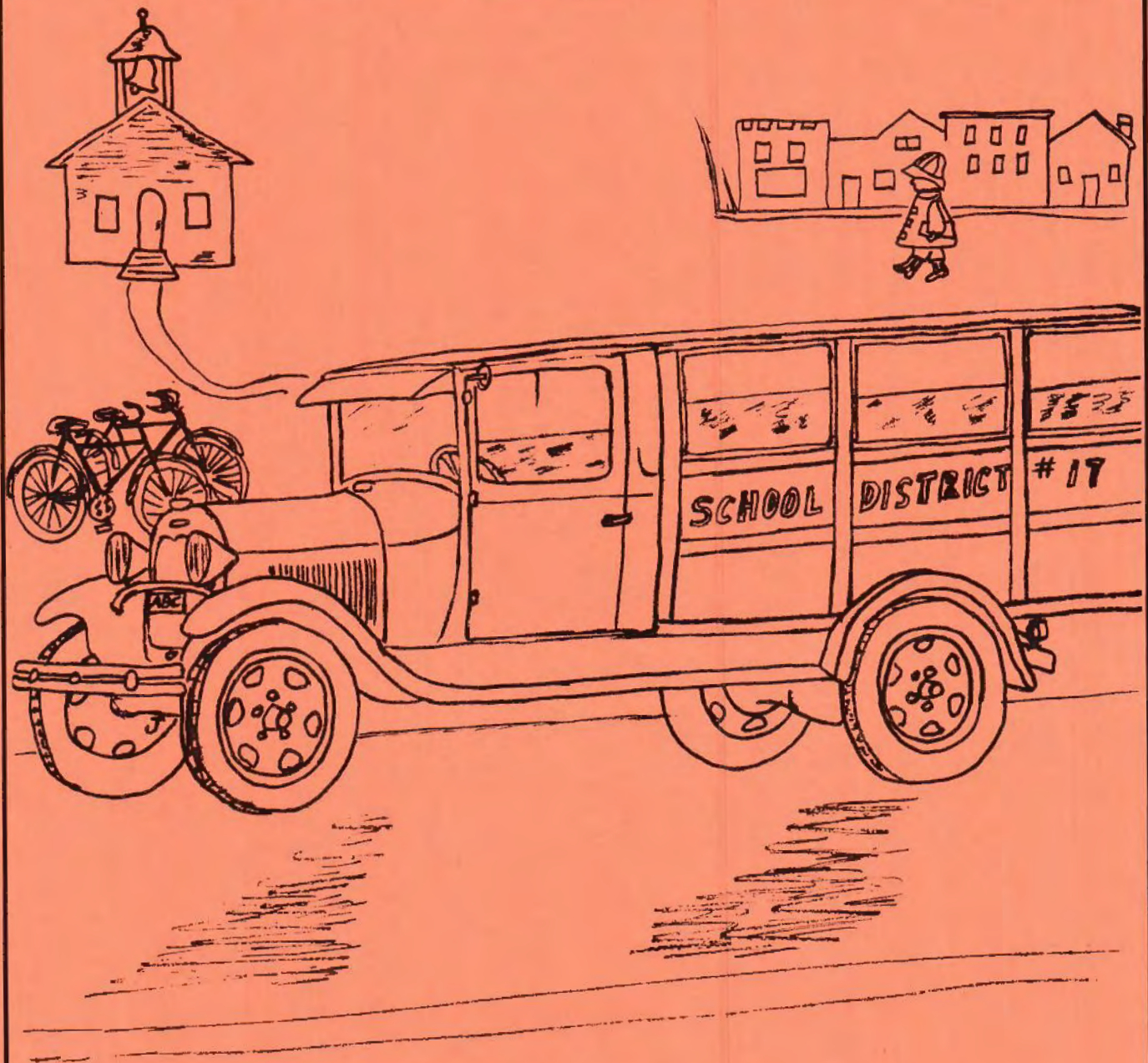

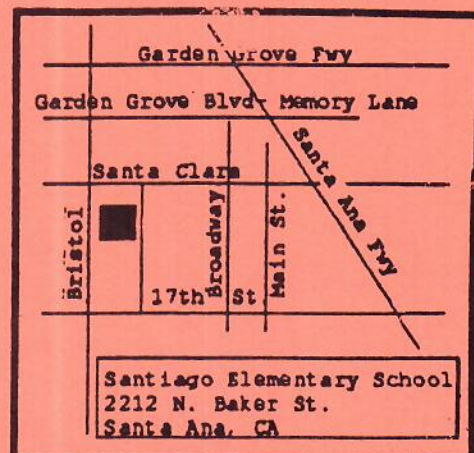

Happy Model "A'ing.

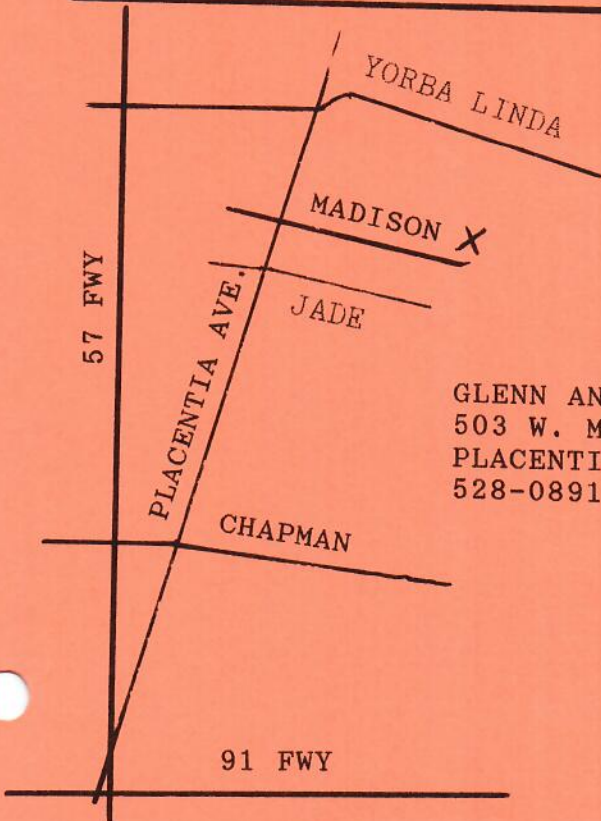
HARD LUCK TROPHY

HERITAGE HILL SHOW

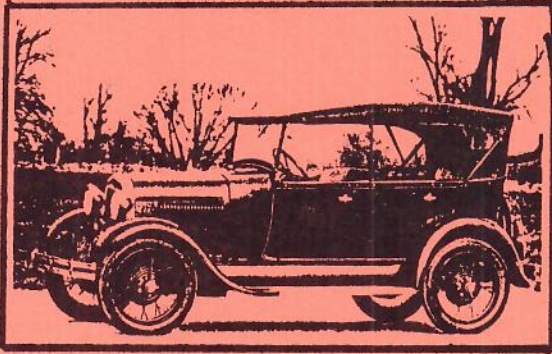

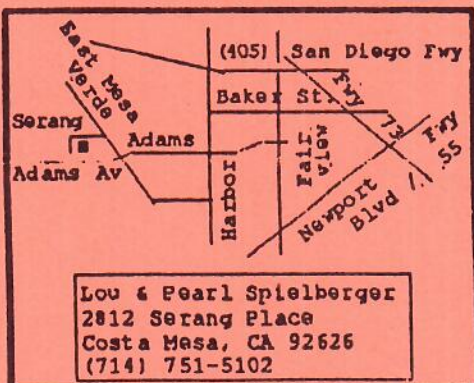
CLUB TRIP TO CATALINA:
