Other special events coming up are The Pancake Breakfast in March and the Buena Park Mall Show in June.



#### IN THE GARAGE

The November technical seminar was a hands-on frame straightening, riveting, welding and repair. We repaired six frames in various conditions. frames left the seminar looking better than when they got there. Bob Patty Ferazzi graciously opened Bob and up their garage and work shop for the seminar. We all were dazzled by Bob's facility --- every tool that you have dreamed of having was there and ready for use. From a lathe to a crescent, they were all there, and lots working space. We finally finished up the last frame about 3:30 P.M. and thus closed up the year for technical Because of the holidays there will be no technical seminar in December.

Paul will be holding the January seminar on headlights on January 14th, 7:30 P.M. at the Lucas's garage. If your headlights are dim, out of focus, flicker or just don't work very well, bring your car and we will diagnose and try to fix the problem. Please let Paul know if you are bringing your car.

This year has really been a lot of fun as your technical director. So many people have pitched in and gave their time, talent and garages, thank you just doesn't seem enough. This is a wonderful club and I am honored to be a part of it. Have a great holiday and we will see you next year.

#### TERRY'S TIPS by Terry Lucas

Many members dread taking their Model A out at night because their headlights simply do not light up the road in front of them very well. A common cause of dim and flickering lights is a poor ground. You must have a good clean circuit from the battery positive post all the way to the headlight bulb for proper illumination.

To correct this I recommend that you start at the battery ground strap. Make sure you have a good clean connection at both ends of the strap. Any corrosion or rust must be cleaned away for a clean connection. The next possible problem area is the front fender bracket. Remove one of the front fender bracket-to-frame bolts. Clean and derust it especially along the shaft. Next take a rat tail file and thoroughly clean to bare steel the hole that the bolt passes through. Put some grease on the bolt to resist rust, and replace and tighten it down well

The next possible current problem area is the headlight bar-to-fender bracket bolts. Remove the bolts and clean rust dirt and paint from the bolt shaft and hole. Then replace and tighten again. The final place for a poor ground connection is the headlights headlight bar. Remove each headlight. Clean out the paint, rust and dirt that is in the bowl where the headlight seats into the headlight bar. and derust the headlight bolts and nuts. Put some grease in the headlight bar bowls, place the headlights back in their position and tighten down. sure to re-align the headlights properly so they aim correctly.

Any poor contact along the way from the battery to the light bulb will make a significant reduction in headlight efficiency.
