







Don't forget the September meeting, we will have a White Elephant Auction. Bring your unwanted items for the auction.



IN THE GARAGE



FREE TOOLS !!


Our club has purchased and has received from donations a number of special tools for helping you repair and restore your Model A.

TERRY'S TIPS

Certain areas of you Model A require special paint if it is going to last. When repainting your carburetor, cast iron sediment bowl (on firewall) and engine splash aprons, be sure to use "hot fuel proof dope paint". It is available at most hobby shops. For the carburetor and sediment bowl use flat or dull black paint and for the engine splash aprons use gloss black. dope paint will not be effected by exposure to gasoline. When painting your brake drums and muffler be sure to use high temperature resistant paint. It is sold in most hardware stores, frequently used for painting barbecues. It will hold up much better than regular paint in these areas.




TECHNICAL SEMINAR MAP



Galifornia's New Y.O.M. License Law

Editor's note: California has recently enacted a vehicle cense law which will permit antique vehicles to be legally registered with license plate from their year of manufacture. This story tells how the new law came about and what it will mean to Model A owners.

I got my Model A by selling one car and taking the "A" as part of the payment. When my wife and I first saw it, we wanted it.

The car was being stored in the corner of a factory. It had character (at least it had us two "characters"). There it was, a little stake bed truck - all red, including the fenders, head-lights, etc.

My wife and I, not knowing anything about Model A's, or any old cars for that matter, thought we'd take it and have a little fun with it. Then we could sell it.

After getting it home, we started researching it. The more we found out about it, the more things didn't seem right. We eventually discovered it was not supposed to be a truck at all. Instead, it was supposed to be a 1928 Fordor sedan (60-A)! Someone had cut and welded it into a truck.

This put us on the trail for Model A parts. Swap meets turned out to be one of the best sources. At one swap meet (the big one at the Rose Bowl), I picked up a pair of 1928 California license plates still in the original Department of Motor Vehicles envelope. I wouldn't be able to register them to my car, but still couldn't resist buying them.

During the first year of restoration the plates would keep intering my mind. One of my best "finds", and I couldn't use them on my Model A.

After talking to a customer of ours, Rep. Robert Badham

(R) of Newport Beach, we were advised to get in touch with our local assemblyman, Dr. Nolan Frizzelle (R) of the 73rd District. We found that Dr. Frizzelle was a man who not only liked antique cars, but would listen to my idea. This contact produced AB2187, an Assembly bill presented to the Calif. State legislature. The bill would make it legal to register the year of manufacture (YOM) plates to an antique auto. For example, 1928 plates could be used on a 1928 car.

I then asked for and received the support of the Association of California Car Clubs (ACCC). ACCC president Win Burkhart, and lobbyist John McLoglin then helped to manuever the bill through the Assembly, and State Senate, and to (then) Governor Jerry Brown's desk, where it was signed into law.

Now, any California auto hobbyist with a car 25 years old or older will, as of July 1st, 1983, be able to file application with the D.M.V. to register YOM plates to the car. The only catch is, there must be 2000 applications by Dec. 31, 1984 for the law to go into effect. Since there are approximately 137,000 eligible cars in California, the odds are pretty good! You can also apply through the ACCC as of January 1983. (Note: It is recommended that interested owners apply through the ACCC, since they will hold the applications until the necessary 2000 are received. In the event the number is not reached and the law does not go into effect, fees paid to the DMV would be forfeited.)

After three and a half years, my Model A is completely restored down to the last detail, the license plates. Our Model A has given us some great challenges, each having its own reward. Along with working on a great car, I have met some even greater people. Thanks to all who helped!
