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



In my opinion there should be a perpetual trophy named for Jim Marsh to be given for the most mileage each year in a Model A.


Notes from the past; March 12, 1970



IN THE GARAGE

The September technical seminar was a lot of fun. We demonstrated tin and copper plating plus chrome and nickel stripping. We then demonstrated stainless steel repair and polishing techniques. The attendees must have had a good time because they didn't leave until almost 11:00 P.M.

The October technical seminar will be held at Glenn Johnson's home, located at 503 W. Madison Ave., Placentia. It will be held Friday evening, October at 7:30 P.M. Glenn demonstrate proper techniques for valve installation and adjustment. He will both solid and adjustable tappets. This is a "don't miss" event, there will be a lot of information available here and it should be a lot of fun.

The November seminar will be on frame straightening and repair. If you have a frame that needs attention get it cleaned up and bring it with you to this seminar. It will be held Saturday November 13th at 8:30 A.M. Welding, riveting and straightening equipment will be available. Location of this seminar is Terry Lucas' house.

TERRY'S TIPS by Terry Lucas

The front license plate mounting call be a little trying at times. If you tighten the bolts tight enough to keep the license from being blown into the radiator, the bolts bend and chip your license plate. This can be particularly bothersome if you have a freshly restored "Year of Manufacture" plate.

A couple of very simple modifications can quickly solve this problem. First mark the headlight bar (if it isn't already chipped) where the license brackets mount, and remove the brackets and license. Take some black plastic electrical tape and wrap each mounting location on the head light Usually about 4" to 5" of tape wrapped around each mounting location is sufficient. The black tape is only barely visible and will give the brackets a surface to grip as well as prevent paint chipping. Next either go to the hardware store and purchase some rubber washers or make them out of an old inner tube. The rubber wash s should slide snugly on the shaft of the license bracket bolt up to the hear of the bolt. A reamed out faucet washer also works pretty well. The rubber washer will cushion the head of the bolt from the license plate and protect it from chipping and bending the plate.

Now the really important part. Very carefully reinstall the plate and brackets. Tighten the bolts just tight enough to be snug and a little bit more. Take your A for a short drive and bring it up to your normal cruising speed. When you finish, check the position of your front license plate. If it has not moved, leave it alone. If it has blown in toward the radiator, tighten each bracket bolt another half turn.

Give a little bit of your time and serve on the board. We can use your help. The election is next month so contact Wade Roberts, Election Chairman, and he will put your name on the ballot.


GOOD NEWS.... THANKS FROM JIM SPAETH....






