



For the September General meeting do not go to Hart Park, the rest of us will be meeting at Santiago Elementary School. Come and join us.







TERRY'S TIPS by Terry Lucas Technical Director

Removal of wheels can often be a paint chipping event if great care is not taken. A simple way to prevent the lug wrench from causing paint damage is to have a designated Model A 4-way lug ench. In the properly sized socket place a wad of duct tape (any kind of tape will work here) large enough to allow the lug nut to enter about 3/4 of the total length of the lug nut or

stopping just short of the sextuple section of the lug. This will prevent the socket of the lug wrench from bottoming out on the wheel and chipping the paint around the lug. Now wrap the shaft of the wrench with several layers of duct or electrical tape. This will cushion the possible contact between the wheel hub and the lug wrench shaft. Now -- BE CAREFUL!! This will help to keep your restored car looking fresh and unchipped.

The North West Regional MAFCA Meet

July 14, at 7:45 A.M. started **The Great Adventure** which was to cover 4042 miles, 8 states, 2 Canadian provences, and 21 days. The Model A had minimal problems.

The first 3 days were hard 387 mi, 347 mi, 318 mi thru the Mojave desert, central Utah, idaho and into Montana. After visiting Towe Ford Museum in Deer Lodge, Mt. where we saw the 31 Phaeton he **drove** from Buenos Aires, Argentina to the USA, we continued to Missoula and called Chuck, Peggy and Jeanne Bloom. They look **great** and seem very happy. The barn is built, they were getting ready for major rehab on the house and the log cabin on the property is perported to have been a bordello.

We stayed over Sunday to rest. The Blooms took us to a steak house that was worth the drive from Orange County.

The "road to the sun" thru Glacier Park was narrow and twisty with deep canyons, snow, glaciers and waterfalls **every where**. The question was always "You didn't **drive** all the way from California, did you? We crossed the Canadian border, the rolling plains and suddenly the big city of Calgary just popped up out of nowhere. We had arrived July 20th at noon after 1683 miles.

Wednesday, we registered and met Ted & Helen Loeffler, Doc & Darlene Ingwersen, former O.C. members Bill & Patsy Heller & Bill Cody. Thursday was busy with car judging, era clothing judging, a tour, driving games and a mixer. I told Doc I wouldn't talk about the driving games.


Friday was an unforgetable 178 mile round trip tour to Banff. Doc said "They complained about 35 miles in San Diego." A police escort blocked off the **freeway** while we got out of town. The huge dining room at the Banff Springs Hotel easily handled all of us plus their regular guests. The buffet was outstanding and the view even better. I don't have enough film to capture it all.

Saturday was another "private" freeway drive to Heritage Park with a steam train, a turn of the century village and a vintage oil well. This evening was the big awards banquet. Doc won a 2nd place for clothing. Probably would have won 1st, but when the judge asked if he had era underwear, he told her he wasn't wearing any underwear! Jeanne and I won 2nd place in clothing and my Tudor won 3rd place. We came close for the longest distance trophy, but a car from Ontario, Ca. won. I should have had the club banner. Lots from Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Nevada, British Columbia, Alberta, Northern California, but none from Southern California.

We drove home by way of Banff, Lake Louise, Golden, Revelstoke and Okanagan Valley, Canada, Wenatchee, Snoqualame, Tacoma, Springfield, and Tum Water, Washington, Portland, Rogue River and Ashland, Oregon and Yreka, Redding, Santa Rosa, Stockton, over the ridge route and arrived home at 10:00 A.M. August 3rd. Yesterday was 108 degrees and we had vapor lock.






