We had lunch at the Peacock Room and it was reasonable. I don't think they were prepared for our good sized tour so the line to order got somewhat long but we had plenty of time.


There were lakes, ponds, fountains and a waterfall as well as the spectacular old house and the railroad station and gardens to enjoy.






