

Lee Jackson gave an update on the 97 pancake breakfast. Sign up sheets will be available for different functions at the January general meeting.


New Business:



There were no serious injuries. Greg, Leslie, and Greg's mother apparently suffered only minor injuries. We hope that all will be recovered soon and that the unfortunate accident won't diminish the Carcerano's enthusiasm for the Model A Ford and for the Model A Ford Club.

Those hardy souls who were still left on the tour ended the evening at Richard & Jeanne Parrish's home where an abundance of excellent home made desserts were served.




