

#### **New Business:**




We are all glad that Pearl Spielberger is back home after a stay in the hospital. Glad to hear she is improving as we go to press.'




## Model A Drawings by Darrell Mountjoy

All the club members put a lot of work into making this a success every year. Everyone deserves a big *CONGRATULATION!* 



By the way, how many of you know that a '96 Camry can carry 2400 eggs and 200 lbs. Of pancake mix?






