Richard Norden the \$25 membership fee as he was not added to the membership list for "98. The motion carried.


Old Business: New Member packets containing tour rules, badge, roster and by-laws will be compiled and distributed to new members.

Keeping Up

Appearances

If your Model A has been restored for a few years, it may not look quite as good as it did when it was fresh. Driving them as much as most of us do causes dirt, grease, chips and other natural deterioration. In fact, even if your car just sits in your garage, dust and natural oxidation will eventually cause it to loose its sparkle. Here are a few tips and tricks I use to keep my Model A's looking as fresh as possible.

*Body and Fender Finish

If you have a few chips you can touch them up with a small brush. Just touching them up will make them look better but if you really want to make chips almost disappear-try this: fill the chip with paint until it is above the surface of the original paint when dry. This may take 2-3 applications because paint shrinks when it drys. Allow at least 1 week for the built up paint to dry. Next using a small wooden block and some 1000 grit color sanding paper with mineral spirits as a wetting agent, carefully sand the built up paint down to the level of the original paint. During this process wipe the area dry often to see your progress. Next rub the area with #7 white rubbing compound on a damp paper towel until it shines. I wax my cars often with pure carnuba wax (no cleaners or abrasives) so I'm not removing any paint. If your paint is oxidized, try #7 white rubbing compound or Meguires #7 polish first applied and rubbed with a damp paper towel. The damp paper towel will absorb the dead paint unlike cloth rags that tend to deep the dead paint on their surface and scratch the finish. Change the paper towels often.

*Bright Work

If your Model A is a 30-31 and the stainless steel was properly buffed when it was restored, it should clean up nicely with soap and water. Simple

Green works super. Never wipe the stainless steel with a dirty cloth. It will scratch. Bumpers and other chrome parts usually clean up with any brand chrome polish, but, if your are starting to deteriorate, try red rubbing compound. Don't forget to paint the depressed areas of your bumper clamps Ford Blue and the end bolts and spacers Gloss Black. If your 28-29 Model A has nickel plated bright work, try simichrome polish to keep that original luster.

*Wheels Tires and Lug Nuts

When removing and replacing wheels, I never use the original lug wrench/crank. It's too hard to control and will chip your wheels. I use a socket with a short extension and a medium length ratchet handle. I cover the socket and the extension with a plastic bag so the socket will not make metal to metal contact with the cad plated lugs and the extension will not chip the spokes if it touches them. Clean unchipped glossy wheels make a big difference in the overall appearance of the car. If your lug nuts are a little shabby, spray them with a light coat of Krylon silver metalic spray paint and re-install them using the plastic bag trick. If you have whitewall tires, try Westley's Bleach White which also cleans blackwalls very well. dressing will keep those blackwalls looking clean and deep black.

*The Radiator

Radiators, because of their intricate surface, collect dirt and are hard to clean. After a while they start to look gray and blotchy and detract from an otherwise nice looking car. Once or twice a year I mask off my radiator shell with tape and newpaper to cover most of the front of the car, throw a sheet or blanket over the hood and front fenders and put some paper or cardboard behind the radiator. I spray the radiator with Krylon #1613 Semi-flat Black. A light coat of paint on the front of the radiator will not effect the cooling and will make it look new again.

*Upholstery and Tops

If your Model A has fabric upholstery and has collected a grease spot or two, try K2R Spotlifter. It's available at most large drug stores. Long/short grain top material turns flat and gray with dirt and

It's available at most large drug stores. Long/short grain top material turns flat and gray with dirt and age. A scrub brush and some tire dressing will make it look new again.

*Chassis and Engine

If your chassis is really dirty like my deluxe delivery was after the Europe tour, you may want to start your cleaning at the coin operated car wash. Once you're home, put the car up on four jack stands, remove the wheels and continue cleaning with soap and water and some solvent (Mineral spirits) applied and scrubbed with an old paint brush. Wrap the metal part of the paint brush with duct tape so it won't scratch your chassis point. Use the same process in the engine compartment until all the dirt and grease is gone. Next spray all chassis and engine parts with WD40 and wipe with paper towels. Finish wiping as dry as possible with old teeshirts or baby diapers and your engine and chassis will shine like new. I learned the WD40 trick from Dan Simmons and it really works.

*Glass

If your cars glass looks a little hazy, try going over it wilth a "new" single edge razor blade to remove and road film, overspray or tar. Next clean with windex or any oither glass cleaner. For super glossy glass, wipe with Brillanize Plexiglass Cleaner available at any plexiglass store.





In Remembrance


