Early AR Oddity

The photo shows the doorsill of a 1928 AR Tudor sedan that I restored in the late 70's. When I removed the stamped Ford script plate, the Ford script and decorative fore and aft dashes were silkscreened on the sill itself. The script was white against the original blue color of the car. In an attempt to bring out the detail from the original color photo to something that would print in our newsletter, I heavily retouched the picture, so the script looks dark against a light background.

Having never seen the silkscreened script on the doorsills of the dozen or so other A's that I've restored, and knowing that Ford Motor Co. wouldn't waste money by silkscreening a part, and then covering it up with a stamped scuffplate, I've attempted to try to figure out how something so obviously wasteful came about.

First, a brief history of the car. It was owned by the granddaughter of the original owner, and after several years of hard service it was retired to chickencoop duty on granddad's farm in Texas. After 28 years of serving as a chicken hotel, the owner decided to have it restored, and brought it to my shop. It was the first car she could remember riding in, she was married to a well to do broker and could afford to have a car restored that really wasn't worth restoring. According to the owner, granddad claimed that it was the first Model A Ford sold in the state of Texas. That sounded like so much Texas brag to me, but when she registered the car, the registration listed the car as a 1927 vehicle rather than a 1928. Texas at that


time listed the year of manufacture as the year in which an automobile was first sold and licensed. For example, if a dealer did not sell a 1930 auto until 1940, it would be titled as a 1940 car. So, it may not have been the first Model A sold in Texas, but it was sold and licensed in 1927. The engine and transmission had been swapped out at some time in the past, so serial number ID was not available as serial numbers change with an engine change in Texas on both registration and title, if you follow all the rules.

At this point, I have to start to theorize. The way I figure, one of two scenarios make sense. First, that in the first lot of A's built, the plan was to silkscreen the doorsills and not provide a scuff plate except as a dealer added option. Then, some bright person at Fomoco realized that the silkscreen wouldn't last long and the order went out to add the scuff plate to all cars. This only gets tenuous when you realize that an accessory item is not usually tooled

to produce a sufficient quantity of pato cover all units in a high volume production.

Second theory goes like this. Scuff plates were planned from the get go, but were not ready to put on at all the factories for the first run, so the sills were silkscreened and the plates installed at the dealer when they became available. This makes sense from a production engineering standpoint, especially if the photo represents a car from a pilot or production proofing run. The vehicles would then have the proper Ford I.D. while in the showroom, and the permanent plate would be installed prior to customer delivery. This scenario works if the lag in delivery of a scuff plate was something less than about two weeks or so.

So, there's the oddity. Anyone who has any other info on this, I'd like to hear it. And if you are restoring a real early AR, and you're a purist, don't forget to silkscreen the sill before you put on the scuff plate.





City Map




