





Look over the list of supporters. All of the companies, clubs, and people who helped make this possible. Thank them all.



Laguna Beach Patriot's Parade

n the morning of March 3rd, MAFCA kingpin and reputed mob leader Vincente "Godfather" Mariola met with associates John" Open Hood" Riggs, his moll Gwen, Richard "Agent Orange" Parrish, his moll Jeanne, Dick "Speedy" Dewey and his moll Donna. Law enforcement agencies tracked their progress south into a neighboring MAFCA familia territory.

It is well known to law enforcement agencies that all MAFCA members drive only Ford automobiles of recent manufacture 1928 through 1931. It was suspected that Orange Co. matriarch Alice "Hungry" Graves had directed this show of force into neighboring territories.

Godfather's gang proceeded without incident into the seaside community of Laguna Beach where they encountered a local dignitary reportedly on the payroll of MAFCA. Godfather chauffeured him in a parade. At least 3 additional godfather associates were seen joining the group. 
"Moll" Donna waits impatiently for the gang to begin.


