



# The Big 40th!

#### Celebration:

The Orange County Model A Ford Club celebrated the first forty years of incorporation on Saturday, August 25, 2001. The event was highlighted by a progressive party that began at noon at the home of Mel & Terry Collings. There was a very large turnout of both people and Model A Fords. Even Warren Hogan broke his cardinal rule of not driving his Model A more than two miles from home. Eleven past club presidents were in attendance, including Richard (RAK) Krist (1970) and Tom Schenk (1979). The Colling's home is located high in the hills of Yorba Linda, which was a steep climb for a Model A Ford. On the trip up the hill Richard Parrish was driving his newly acquired blindback sedan (the one with the potato chip paint finish) when the radiator cap blew off and traveled clear over the Model A following behind him, and landed harmlessly in the street. It is a historical fact that Richard Parrish's name appears on the original 1961 articles of incorporation of the club.

#### The party moves on:

After a few hours at the Colling's, it was time to move on to Bob & Patty Ferazzi's home in Santa Ana. People and Model A's broke up into small groups and headed out using different routes. Since I am not familiar with the east end of the county, I followed Richard & Jeanne Parrish, prudently keeping a safe distance back from their surface to air radiator cap. As our caravan proceeded down through Santa Ana, I heard what sounded like a gargling sound coming from behind me. I then realized that Little Jimmy Nichols, who was following behind me, had his ahoogah horn stuck. It was making a long "ooog" sound, but without the "guh" part. I also noticed that people on the street and sidewalk were scurrying in all directions. I suspect they thought it was the INS. I radioed Richard Parrish with a request to pull over and let LIN fix his horn. Besides being totally focused on his radiator cap, Richard does not hear very well, but Jeanne responded and said they would stop. With that the horn was silenced and the panic on the street subsided. At the Ferazzi home we were treated to more food, and more people and Model A Fords showed up.

#### The third and final stop:

Late in the afternoon we traveled, again in small groups, to Ken & Janet Zittrer's home in Lake

Forest. At the continuation of the party there, I listened to a conversation of several of the club "elders". The question was, "Which Model A Ford has been in the club the longest?" It was suggested that a 1931 Town Sedan named "Esmerelda" might be the car that has been in the club the longest, though owned by a number of different people. Richard Krist acknowledged that he bought Esmerelda from a club member after it had been in a front-end collision. He repaired the car and drove it a number of years before he sold it to Red Kiser. Red entered it in the touring class competition at the 1990 MAFCA National in San Diego and won a first place. Sometime later he sold it to Al Zannino, who eventually sold it to Michael & Diana Wierman, who are the current owners. Esmerelda was featured in the book "Henry's Lady" while owned by Richard Krist. It can be seen on page 219 of the publication.

#### The Club Greeter:

Jon & Pam Heiland own several Model A Fords that date back to when they were in their early teens. However, they Heiland's didn't join the club until 1964 when they became grown-ups and were then able to drive.

#### The Godfather:

Vince & Joan Mariola have been in the club since 1963 and have owned their 1931 S/W Town Sedan since 1961. Their car may well be the oldest Model A Ford in the club. Mr. & Mrs. Godfather were not in attendance at the Big 40<sup>th</sup>. They were attending the wedding of their granddaughter. We missed them and wished they could have been with us.

#### Conclusion:

It was the end of a perfect day. I followed Richard Parrish back to our end of town. He was still focused on his radiator cap and occasionally would stop and pour water in the radiator. Several of us ended up at Richard & Jeanne's new house in Anaheim, where we inspected his recently built Model A Ford garage and we christened it with some beer bottles.

Well, this was definitely a car lover's dream show event with lots of testosterone evident everywhere. 17 Model A's from our OCMAFC, with me in my modern, (in case I wanted to duck out early), met up either at the Mall of Orange or were picked up along the way. The opening ceremonies included prayer and a moment of silence for the men who have died with prostate cancer and for those who are currently in treatment, as well as for the men and women who died last week in New York, Washington and Pennsylvania. A huge American flag was raised with a crane so that everyone could see, as we sang The Star Spangled Banner. A long parade of over 50 antique fire-engines with their whistles, sirens and lights blaring cruised down each runway, followed by police cars, and then many of the entrants vehicles. It was truly a sight to behold. There was lots of flag waving and good old American guy-type energy. I heard many exclaim that this was the biggest and best car show event they had ever participated in.

So, save September 28, 2002, when this same event will be held. Let's get even more of our members to participate, remembering that 100% of the money raised goes to support Prostate Cancer Research.




