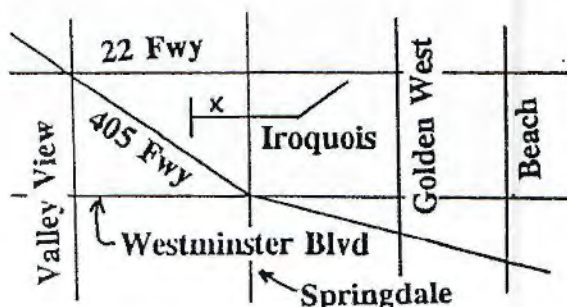

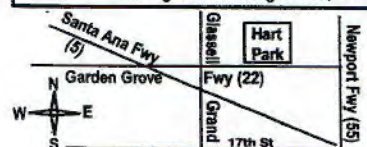

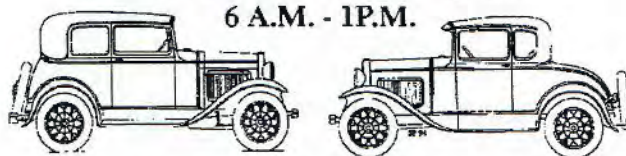

# The Birth (or Rebirth) of a Car

John Knox had a sneaky way of getting me to write an article. He took a picture of my car and afterwards said that he was going to put it in the Distributor and would like me to write a few words about it. Well, here it is

The Start and the Vision It all began when Sylvia said that we needed a larger Model A. After all we can't really take friends very well in the Coupe and the girls were always complaining when they had to ride in the rumble seat. How about that, guys, your wife telling you to go buy another A!!! That opened the door to a car I have always wanted...a station wagon. The search began, but those prices....wow! But undaunted, I kept up the search. Then off some car search web site showed up a two-door wagon that was very reasonable. A series of e-mails, many questions, and e-mail photos, plus "all the rebuilt" parts led me to believe that this was the right car. A deal was struck and arrangements made for shipping.

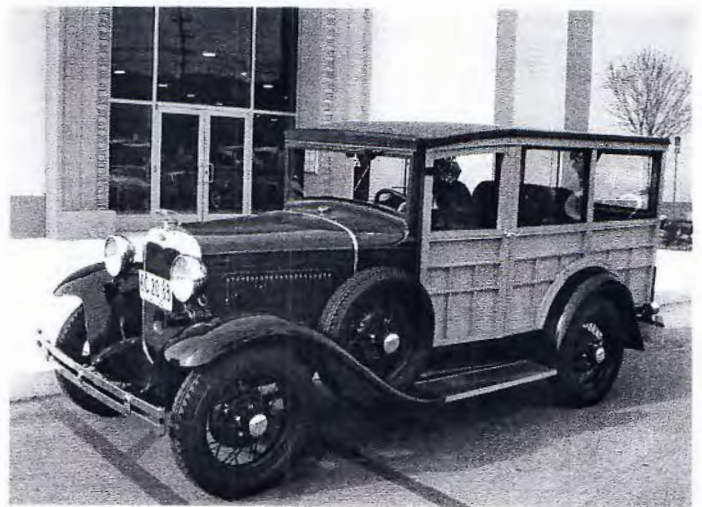
Reality Strikes When the car finally got here...well, it didn't look really as nice as in the photos. In fact it needed a lot of help. In fact, it needed a lot more than a lot of help. The rebuilt wagon box was about the only thing that seemed O.K. It barely drove the block from the delivery truck to the house. Once in the garage, the real assessment came...I NEED TO REBUILD OR REPLACE EVERYTHING! About two week later there was nothing left of a car but a frame with the back half of a wagon box. Some of the things I found included the sheet metal made a great sieve (more holes than metal). A ton of parts were missing. AND it was a repro wagon, not an original. As I tore it down, the unique qualities of the car ranged from an engine that was beld together with silicon sealant, to rear brake parts that were welded together because there was no nut or bolt, to steering with six to eight inches of play, radius rod that broke in half when removed, and onward

Creativity strikes back Once faced with what I had to do, AND (bless her) with full support of Sylvia, this opened to door to make a great touring vehicle. I didn't feel obligated to history and total originality. I could become very creative with color, interior, tailgate, windows, and on and on. I began to sketch

down ideas and drawings of how things would go together. This would become a couple of years project, but it would incorporate a lot of ideas, some that would work and others that, well.....

Parts, parts and more parts. As parts began to come in and as I began to search for other parts and sources to help with some of my ideas, the highs and lows came with them. Sylvia really learned what swap meets were. (She had a lot of input such as: "you REALLY need THAT?" and "what is it?" to "why is it so dirty?") I also owe a debt of gratitude to John Frazee, his wife and his dad. Not only did they answer tons of questions, but John invited us down to Carlsbad to see some wagons, both complete and in progress. Thanks, John. The rebuilding of the chassis, drive train, front end and mechanical parts were straightforward from my past experiences. Tom Endy did the rear end. Larry Reed did the engine. Paint and upholstery by others. But the real challenge was creating the car I wanted with windows, tailgate, and comfort for touring. As any restoration, there are a lot of other stories concerning the various aspects of the project.

On the road again Just under two years later, the car made its initial tour with the club to H & H Engineering. There and back in one piece and safely. Since then we have continued to work on it refining and improving lots of little details. So watch out for us in that Model A that is also not so Model A. The Jaguar red one.

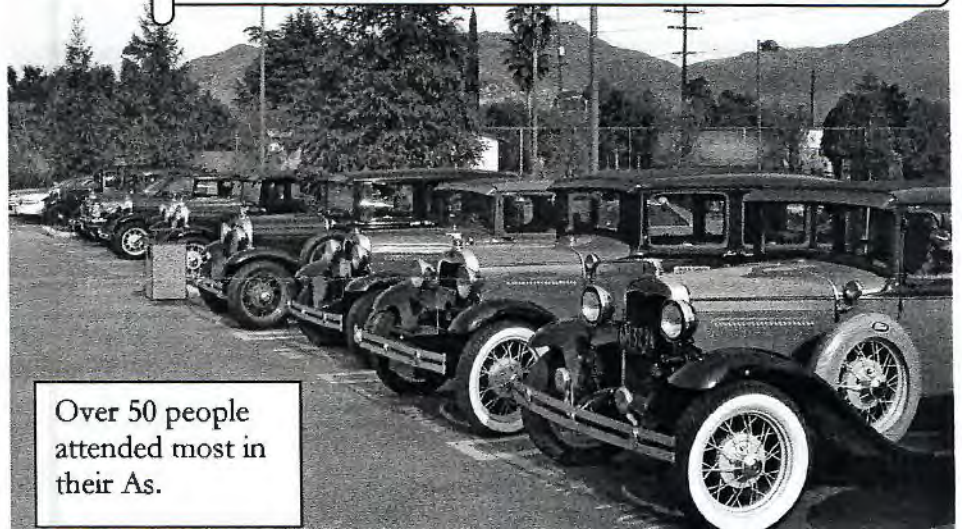
**Kenny Dierkens'** mother, **Val** hospitalized for pneumonia conditions.

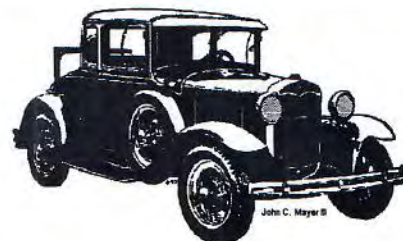

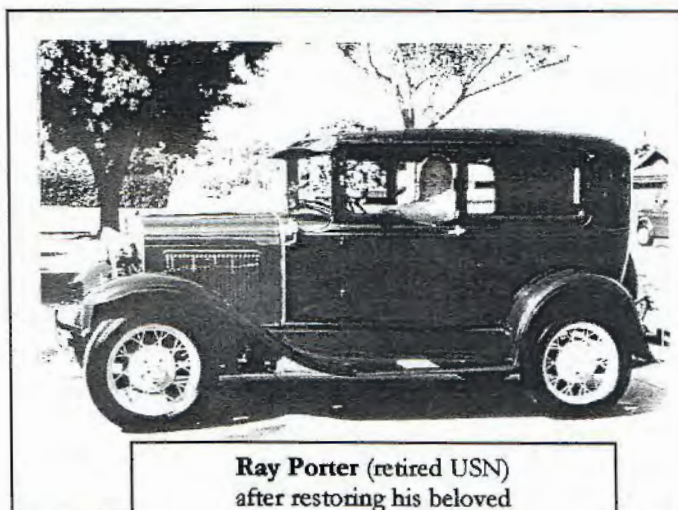

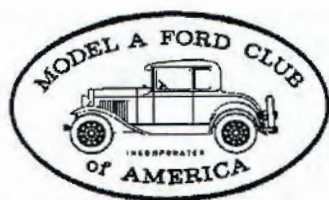

## RECYCLE USED MOTOR OIL

Each year millions of gallons of used motor oil are dumped down storm drains, buried in backyards or emptied in trash dumpsters. These actions are illegal and harmful to the environment. Improperly disposed of used oil can contaminate ground water in wells, affect wildlife, aquatic species, and recreational water uses.

### Some Facts About Used Oil

- ♣ Used oil is considered a hazardous waste in California
- ♣ Over 206 million gallons of lubricating, industrial and automotive oil were sold in California in 1995.
- ♣ Less than 60% of the oil sold nationwide is recycled.
- ♣ One gallon of oil can ruin the taste of 1 million gallons of drinking water.
- ♣ One pint of oil can produce a slick of approximately one acre of surface water
- ♣ Crankcase oil drainings account for more than 40% of total oil pollution in the nation's harbors and waterways
- ♣ 1 in 4 households in California have a Do-it-Yourself oil changer
- ♣ If all the oil generated by do-it-yourself oil changers in California was collected and re-refined, it would provide enough oil for over 5 million cars each year.

The January meeting was held at Children's Hospital Wade Education Center with **John Riggs** presiding. The new board will be installed January 12 at the annual banquet.

Minutes of the December meeting were approved as printed in The Distributor. Secretary **Kathie Mc Call** provided an overview of the November Board meeting. There was no board meeting in December.

Activities Report by **Gwen Riggs** included a reminder of the incoming-outgoing board meeting January 15 at the **Adelman's** home. **Don Schmidt** provided details for the Nethercutt Museum tour 1/26/02. Gwen then introduced the incoming Activities Chairman for 2002 Ken Zittler. Ken announced a one day tour to the Santa Anita Horse races for 2/23 and solicits ideas and support for upcoming activities. **Peggy Nunes** is the Special Events Chairperson. This includes the Pancake Breakfast. Sign up lists were passed around and every one is encouraged to take part in some way. Congratulations to **Terry Armstrong** who is the first person to volunteer! Gwen provided flyers for the Central California Regional event in San Luis Obispo 3/21-24.

No Technical Report. Incoming chairperson Paul Steed was absent. **Dorothy Knox** provided last minute details on the banquet to be held 1/15 at The Phoenix Club.

**NEW BUSINESS:** President John introduced the idea of holding the annual banquet in December next year since some members prefer the idea of a holiday party and to avoid some of the problems encountered with the late date for the installation this year. With 53 members in attendance, 22 voted in favor of holding the event in December, 15 voted in favor of early January, and 16 abstentions.

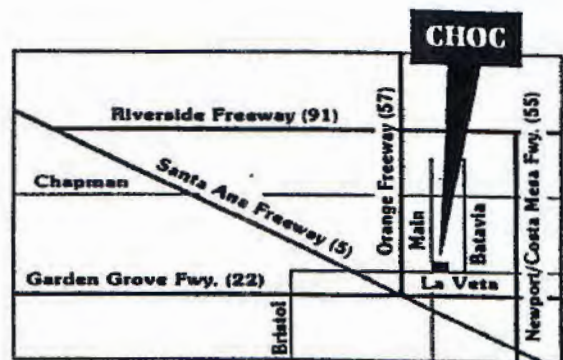
