"See What Great Things We Can Do In 2002"

Most of us ladies know the many uses of household vinegar. We have used it in many ways. One bottle of white distilled vinegar contains a whole shelf's worth of specialized cleaners.

Laundry Hints

Soft fluffy blankets: 2 cups of white vinegar added to a washer tub of water will make a good rinse for both cotton and wool blankets - leaves them free of soap odor and their nap is soft and fluffy as new.

Scorch marks: Lightly rub white vinegar on fabric that has been slightly scorched. Wipe with a clean cloth.

Deodorant stains: To get rid of stains left by deodorants and anti-perspirants on washables, lightly rub with white vinegar and then launder as usual.

Sharper creases: For a sharper crease in knit slacks, dampen them with a cloth wrung out from a solution of one-third white vinegar and two-thirds water. Place a brown paper bag over the crease and press.

Setting colors: When you are color dyeing, add about a cup full of white vinegar to the last rinse water to help set the color.

After alterations: When you remove a hem or seam and have holes from thread showing, dampen a cloth with white vinegar, put it under the material and press.

Now what does that have to do with us? Well you may be surprised, since I was recently reminded by our friends at

the Santa Barbara Chapter in a recent issue of "The Mohair Flyer", about the many uses of Vinegar and our Model A Fords.

Model A Hints:

To remove tough stains: in a car; rub gently with vinegar then wash as usual.

To remove decals: brush on vinegar and let it soak in, then wash.

To dissolve rust: on nuts and bolts or other metal, soak in full-strength vinegar.

To polish car chrome: apply fullstrength vinegar with a soft cloth.

To keep car windows frost-free: coat windows the night before with a solution of three parts vinegar to one part water.

To remove smoke order: from a car, add one-quarter cup of vinegar to five gallons of hot water. Let this solution sit in the car overnight

To clean stainless steel: wipe down with a cloth dampened with vinegar.

To clean car glass: spray windows with vinegar and wipe dry with a soft cloth.

What does vinegar have to do with Orange County Model A Club?

Well we can now see that something, which appears as average or strong, can be put to good use. Our club is made up of many different individuals and each and every one of us, on the outside appear average. We may in our attitudes appear to be strong, spicy, peppery, mild, sweet, sugary, salty or vinegary. We each add our own unique flavor to our club. Each ingredient is important to the recipe of a healthy and great organization. We each bring our own unique and special talents to the group, which makes our group that much stronger. 

Tom showing us how to take apart the rear end the right way. It takes the right tools and the right know how to do the job right. Right!





MODEL A SAFETY CHECK-UP

(Refer to a service manual for proper adjustments)

 $\sqrt{=ok}$, 0 = not ok, repair

ENGINE COMPARTMENT

no gas leak around any fittings nor the carburetor.

no looseness in steering box as wheel is turned (2 inch max)

no loose distributor play

fan belt tension (no cracks)

no cracked fan at hub

no radiator leaks

no cracked radiator hoses

tighten radiator hoses

no head gasket leaks

check head torque

no frayed wires nor loose

connections

oil level up to "F" (varies by stick)

UNDERCARRIAGE, WHEELS AND TIRES

(overdrive?) connections and oil level no loose kingpins all cotter pins in and secure no bent tie rods nor drag link correct steering box bolts, nuts & pins no broken leaf springs nor missing shackles no loose shock arms no cracked wheels no play in wheels when on jacks no oil leaks around hub caps no loose lug nuts. Torque to specification no worn tires and/or cuts in tires no transmission leaks battery secure no loose wheel bearings spin wheels for wobble

inspect ball cap for proper fit, nuts & pins


check loose body bolts (very common!)

no bent brake rods

inspect for exhaust leaks

Follow all service chart lubrication recommendations related to the mileage from last time serviced. Lube all lubrication points at least annually and when heading for an extended trip.


