

## Properly Oiled!

#### Rebuilding The Rear End!

The rebuilding of the Model A differential requires that the four bearings in the rear end be adjusted to a proper pre-load. This is accomplished by selecting the quantity and placement of the proper thickness of banjo gaskets, and by adjusting the locking nuts on the pinion gear. All of the "How To" books describe how to correctly do the job. Proper preloading of the bearings is critical to good performance of the differential. The pre-loading of a bearing is the amount of "side squeeze" that is placed on the bearing. The pre-load procedure is a tedious and time consuming project. It always puzzled me how Ford could produce Model A's so fast with such a cumbersome assembly procedure. I have come to the conclusion that during Model A production Ford must have had a rigid control over his manufacturing tolerances and his bearing supplier such that the assembler only had to install a gasket of an established thickness to each side of the the pre-load was automatically established. I helieve that it is only in the modern era and using the replacement Timken bearings where the need for all the trial and error gasket shimming has come to be a necessity My own experience has been that it takes from .040 to .060 total thickness of banjo gaskets to obtain the proper pre-load of the two Timken bearings mounted on the ring gear carrier assembly. If you simply place a single .005 to .010 gasket on each side of the banjo the bearings will be way too tight and they will eventually become galled and ruined. The bearings will also probably spin on the carrier mount and ruin the carrier. I have taken several "restored" differentials apart that had new Timken bearings installed with a single gasket on each banjo side and found the bearings and races galled and damaged, and the bearings spun on the carrier mounting. If you split a banjo apart for any reason, like to replace an axle, and you are not replacing bearings or going through the pre-load procedure, it would be prudent to install the same thickness of gaskets as you found in place when you disassembled it. @

#### Technically Speaking

One of our members **David Hoonsbeen** let the BMW Car Club of America use his car as a guinea pig for a smog test. Here are some of the results as excerpted from their Los Angeles publication: "Whispering Bomb" Written by Phil Street.

Today, lots of people have never heard of Henry Ford's "Model A". Viewing the two together, we see what evolution has done to align the thoughts of the automotive enthusiast and for the need to live peacefully without dingy skies, breathing problems, and burning eyes. Some people call it progress. Some people call it government interference and misuse of taxpayer funds.

For this comparison, we chose a 1931 Model A Ford to compare to a 2001 BMW Three Series. The Five Gas TAS Smog Analyzer would not accept data about the 70 year old Model A because there were no emissions standards existing at the time of its manufacture. Using 1974 CA emissions standards as the most generous allowed by the CA Bureau of Automotive Repair at this time (2001), we can see the measured results in the attached VIR for our 1931 test vehicle. Surprisingly, the old Ford passed the tailpipe part of the test OK except for Carbon Monoxide (CO), where it failed miserably and was awarded the GROSS POLLUTER certificate. It is believed that with the turn of a single screw knob on the dashboard, (continued page #10)

the carburetor enrichment mixture could have been manually adjusted to bring the CO within CA specs to comply with the 1974 model year requirements. However, no adjustments are allowed during the ASM SMOG TEST. Conforming to CA 2001 emissions specs would not be so easy as they are about 10% of the 1974 requirements

For the Visual and Functional portions of the 2001 ASM SMOG TEST, there were lots of problems. Some of these deficiencies could be corrected quite easily. Others would be difficult or too costly. The Ford came with an open crankcase breather pipe which empties combustion bi-products onto the ground. The Ford has no provision for a Catalytic Converter, or an EGR valve, no vacuum sensors, no ECU Computer brain, no 02 Sensor, no fuel fillpipe restrictor for leaded gas, no sealed fuel tank or vent, no thermostatic air cleaner or cold air box, no exhaust air injection, no fuel evaporative filters, valves or controls, no knock sensors, no check engine warning lights, no fuel injection option, no insulated spark plug wires, no spark suppression, no fuel pump and no On Board Diagnostics....

What the Model A does have, turns out to be very important. There is a manually operated spark advance control lever on the steering column, and a mixture control on the dashboard. Ignition timing has a wide band of manual control, but relies on an alert driver to keep it adjusted correctly. The mixture adjustment control varies tremendously according to driving and weather conditions, but would take a second person or a DME Computer to operate quickly and effectively in varying traffic situations.

The 4 cylinder Ford flathead 3.3 Litre 2 valve engine is about the same displacement as that of a 2001 333 HP, 6 cylinder, 4 valve M-3 BMW except that it develops only 40 HP at 2200 RPM.... The TAS Analyzer didn't like the slow and lumbering engine measurement speeds, but we didn't tell the TAS about the 2500 RPM Red Line limit or the 100 RPM idle speed....






