# Hawaii 2003

September Update:

Cruise Paradise II is being planned for next Summer (June 22 through July 8, 2003). Hotel rates have been established at both Hilo and Kona. On the Hilo side they range from \$65. to \$99. per night. The best value is at the Hilo Hawaiian Hotel at \$75. per night. On the Kona side the rate is \$99. per night at the King Kamehameha Hotel. Eleven nights will be spent in Hilo, five nights in Kona.

Air Fare:

The best rate we have obtained is \$545. per person, round trip, direct from the Orange County Airport to Hilo. We do not have to go through Honolulu, and there is no additional inter island fare. Departure date is June 22, return date July 8, 2003.

Car Shipment:

We will not have a firm price from the Matson Steamship Company until the first of the year. The price paid for the 2001 tour was \$1100. per car, round trip. It is anticipated that the price for 2003 will be only slightly higher. There is also the three verses two car per container issue that is being explored, which may reduce our price.

Periodic Updates:

Between now and next Summer I will provide periodic updates of the planning process in the Distributor. However, it will be general information only. Specific information, along with the necessary forms will be provided to those who sign up for the tour. 




Our sympathy to **Ken and Janet Zittrer** on the death of Ken's mother last month.


