

Spring Spree in '03

We also want to thank God for a beautiful day.

Now we can sit back and relax. Well sort of. Now it is time for some more fun. It's time to put her in overdrive. It's time to rock and roll! One of the things I mentioned a few months back, "A Picture Spree in '03". It would be nice to explore, if we were interested, in putting together of a list of people and their cars, with pictures, who would be interested in periodically allowing their cars to be used in movies, TV and magazines. Since mentioning this in the earlier article, we have had several inquiries about this from folks who are interested. Please allow me an opportunity to share my experience with this, as you may he curious.

We have had our cars in all three types of media. The basic process is that you register your car with an agency. They keep the picture of the car on file along with your name and phone number. When they get a "casting call" for cars from a media producer/director, the pictures of the types of cars are reviewed and they make selections. If selected, you get a call to have the car at such and such a location at a certain time. If it is any distance away the agent or production company may supply transportation for your car. You are advised of the day and time the car is to be used, how it is to be used. If it needs to be driven you will he contacted about the appropriate attire for the situation. Most of the time your period cloths are just what is ordered.

At the end of the day you earn some money for yourself and your car earns you some money too. There is a lot of waiting around (bring a good book), but it is interesting to see. Be sure and bring a pen, perhaps you will need to sign an autograph or two for your car.

You can always turn the offer down as it is generally short notice. But it is fun; you get to see all sorts of period stuff on the sets as well as other people's cars. Most of the time you will have your car parked in the background or you will be driving it yourself in a street scene and therefore need to be with your car during any type of filming. Filmmakers are very creative and spontaneous individuals so what may have originally been planned may change suddenly. Remember if this happens, and you feel uncomfortable about any shoot, it is your car, say something or remove your car from the production. We have never had to do this but we have been with the car to consult and advise. Be alert, damage can happen, cameras are very large and bulky and our cars are quite small inside.

My '30 PU "Hank" has just finished eight days of sbooting in the up coming movie "Seabiscuit". It consisted of two days at a Santa Anita Race stable as background. This will probably never show up in the film. Then it was picked to play a very important scene, the "crash" scene. Now that was frightening! The scene is about Frankie Howard, the son of Seabiscuit's owner. Mike and I coached him on how to shift and do the pedal work. They shot film of his hands and feet hut he never really drove the truck. The driving was all done by his stunt double. Frankie is a young boy who takes his dad's truck one day while his folks are away to go fishing. Well things go wrong and ... Well you would not want me to give away the story now, would you? Let's just take your worries away by saving the film has completed shooting and my truck was seen at the Pancake Breakfast. In fact thanks to all of you who voted, I won "Best of Show". At the Pancake Breakfast there was a small display of photos, prop newspaper, and script pages, along with the call sheets, as well as a picture from the crash sequence. 




