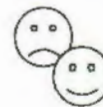

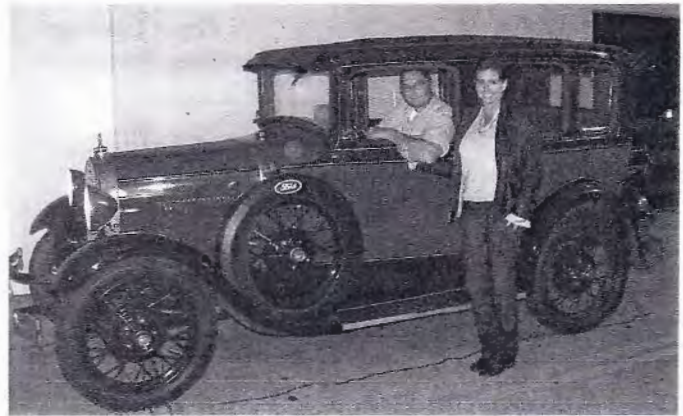

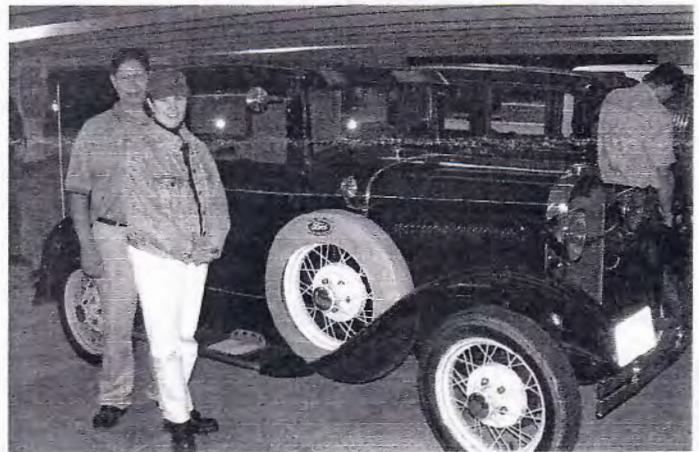

All SW Sedans had a metal panel at the quarter window for the regulator, even the 160-C.

We have found three different types. (There may be others) All had the Briggs Bug. It is possible to have two different types in one car. (Note the pictures in the *Restorer*)

- Type 1 Left Top edge has wood strip
- Type 1 Right Top edge has wood strip
- Type 2 Left Flat top edge with cinch nuts (also known as 'D' nuts)
- Type 2 Right Flat top edge with cinch nuts
- Type 3 Left Rounded indented top with capture nuts (square nuts in a cage)
- Type 3 Right Rounded indented top with capture nuts

Body wood (vertical at doors and quarter windows) secured by metal tabs or flathead screws

160-C, does it have a horizontal wood stiffener against the Blind quarter panel? Yes No

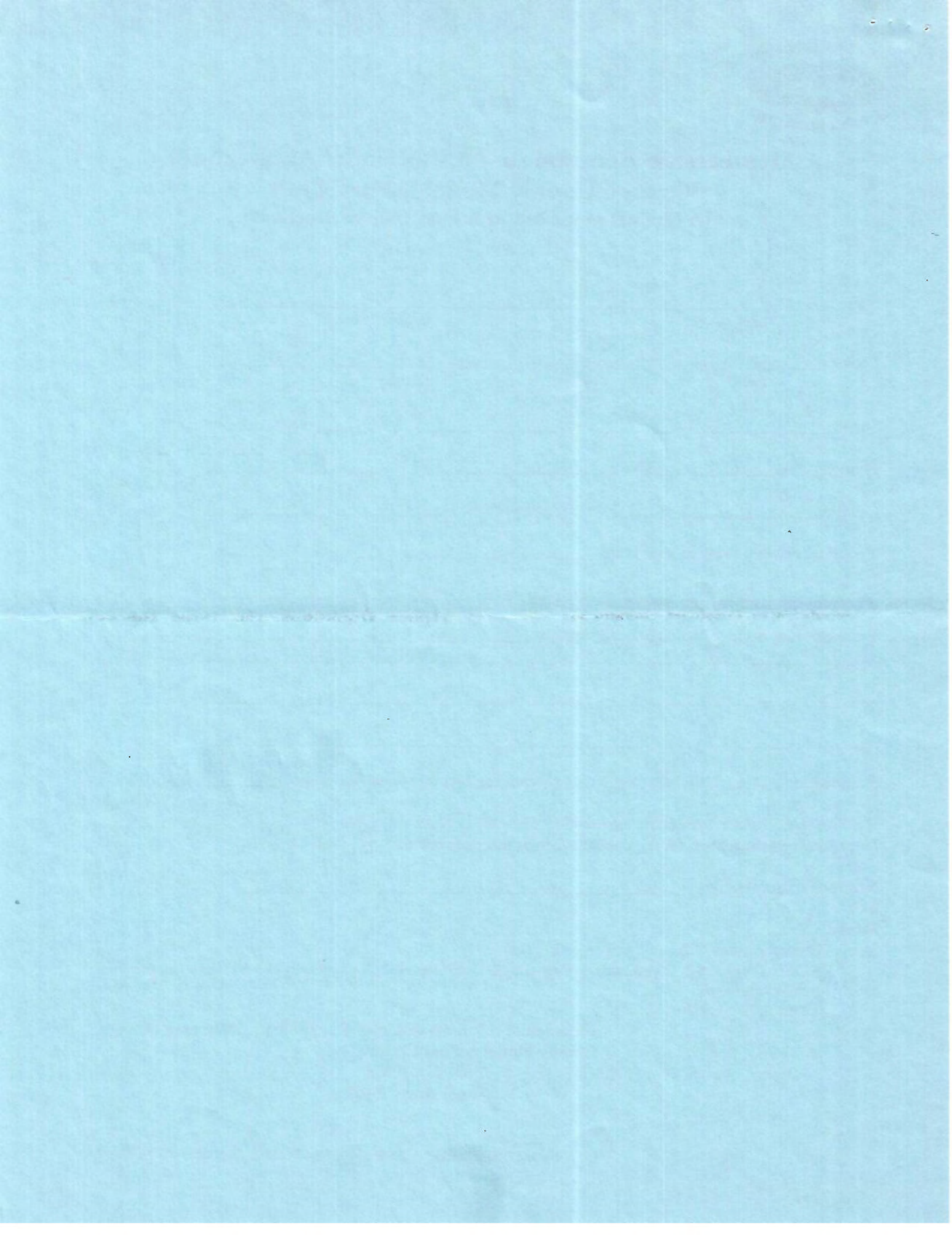

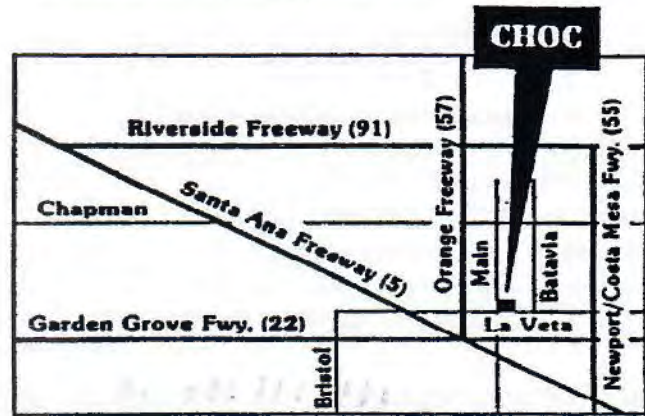
