
Every Fall the club tours to Palm Springs to see the Fabulous Palm Springs Follies. It is always a great weekend and this year was no exception.

Folks, this is a great tour. If you have never been to the Follies, make 2003 your first time. I guarantee you'll want to go back. \bigotimes










