

First of all, on behalf of the entire Club, I want to thank **Diana and Mike** for all they have done for our group.













April Technical Seminar 4-19-03 --Rebuilding Carburetors

Tom Endy treated us to a great seminar on rebuilding the Model A carburetor.

Hark Hervey-Smith's gizmo to test the proper gasoline flow for carburetor needle valves. Height gives the proper pressure to send the gasoline through the valve jet to be measured. The volume that passes through tells if it is the correct size or not.



Dan Adelmann's article and plans for building another version appears in the July 1999 *Distributor* pg. 8. Another reference is March/April 1985 *Model A News*. Another is Jan/Feb 1983 *Model A Times*.

Below are the specifications from one of Tom's old articles recommended on repairing jet openings to give correct flow.

Jets:

Most jets are repairable and reusable. If openings are to large, then solder the ends closed, re-drill and check with a proper size drill bit. ("no go" means that size drill should not fit in the hole)

1. Main jet	#63 Go,	#62 No-Go	(fiber washer)
2. Comp jet	#65 Go,	#64 No-Go	(fiber washer)
3. Cap jet	#63 Go,	#62 No-Go	(fiber washer)
4. Idle jet	#75 Go,	#74 No-Go	(no washer)


