

Various club members filled in on Thursday and Friday welcoming arrive-ing participants, but







Next stop was Rancho Carrillo, a combination antique store and museum. It was a fabulous collection in his barn.



Greeter Jon Heiland welcomed & introduced guests & new members Don Tilly & Pete & Trish Cruise.

Sunshine & Sorrow: Gwen Riggs announced that John Biscay died on Friday, 10/3/03 and that the funeral would be Friday, 10/10. Matt & Laura Ricketts had a baby girl. Joan Mariola's knee surgery has been postponed.

Car of the Month - none.


Raffle - no raffle due to Shoe Box Swap Meet.

8 Model A's turned out to represent our club and had a fun day visiting, cruising, eating (of course) and just watching the other cars go by. The group was joined by a CHOC friend, Joe Robinson and his very rare 1954 Kaiser, yellow in color with the most unusual doors, which slid into the front bumpers

when open. Another friend (Jack) came with his 1957 Chevrolet (Yikes!) station wagon. Some of the men got their free prostate screening blood test. All proceeds from the event go toward prostate cancer research. The club donated an additional \$100.00.

Dale McCall was the only 'survivor' from our OCMAFCA gang who stood for the group picture, a sea of light blue survivor tee shirts.

Several in the "A" group were brave enough to have the blood test (PSA), which is free and a simple way to identify whether prostate specific antigens are circulating around the body. 


