





This is not a recommendation for The Club to give or not give a scholarship. The following are some suggestions as to how it might be done if The Club chooses to award a scholarship.

- The decision to award or not award one or more scholarships should be made each year by a vote of club members following a recommendation of the board members.
- 2. All scholarships would be for one year.
- 3. A recipient of a scholarship would be allowed to apply again the following year.
- 4. The amount and the number of scholarships should be determined yearly. If The Club has sufficient money, it might choose to offer two or more small scholarships instead of one larger one.
- 5. The Club would determine who would be eligible, i.e., children, grandchildren, relatives of club members, club members, or anyone who might desire to apply who meets the qualifications as determined by The Club.
- 6. A scholarship committee of at least three persons should be established. These members could be club members or individuals selected from other Model A clubs, or citizens of the community, or a combination of the above.
- 7. All applicants might be required to do any or all of the following plus other things The Club might wish to include: a. A letter of application. b. A transcript from schools attended from high school and beyond.
- c. Several letters of recommendation which might include any or all of the following: (1) One or more letters from club members. (2) One or more letters from present or former teachers. (3) One or more letters from other people in the community who know the applicant, such as religious leaders, youth leaders, neighbors or friends.
- 8. The scholarship could be used for attending a community college, a university, a trade school, or other appropriate education or training approved by The Club.
