Remember, in September we will return to our regular time and room for our monthly meetings.


LET'S KEEP DRIVING THOSE MODEL A's !!!



But for many of us, the road to Era Fashions started off as just a way to interest ourselves, while our spouses lost themselves under the car. Once that door was opened, we became fascinated with the fashions of the Era. Many of you are looking ahead to our convention in

off Model A fashions, as well as cars. Maybe you are just planning to go to a Regional Meet, which is another excellent time to display your outfits. If neither of these events are within your reach, you can still wear them to a few Chapter functions, organize your own local fashion show for your own Chapter, or get together with other Chapters in your area and plan a joint fashion show, maybe combined with a local car show as well!

Maybe you're saying, "Nobody in our Chapter knows anything about Model A fashions." Well, just remember, "All knowledge begins with doubt." A place to start in this case is to organize a "Fashion Clinic." Get a copy of the MAFCA *Fashion Guidelines*, comb your old magazine shops, and buy at least one magazine from each year, 1928, 1929, 1930 and 1931. Copy the fashion articles out of all your old issues of The Restorer to use for reference. Organize a tour to vintage clothing and antique stores.

Though, of course, I'd like to get you booked on Era Fashions, there are still many other facets of our Era that may capture your interest. How about depression glass, Art Deco objects, pictures or furniture, advertising from the Model A years, gas pumps and memorabilia...era toys, banks and dolls. These are only a few of the many fields to explore.

Getting back to Era Fashions, whether you are a novice or consider yourself knowledgeable, there is always a lot to learn, and a lot of fun to be had with Era Fashions. So share what you do know and look for information on what you do not know. And while you're doing this, you will have fun together and make your hobby a more enjoyable and truly fulfilling experience.

As I have said before, you will find that entering a fashion show is not only fun, but a learning experience - especially for the novice! It is a fun experience to show off your outfit, whether it is correct or not, and you will learn what is wrong with it and how you can make it correct. Don't forget, when a judge grades you down, she must state why. This is very helpful. I remember when I first entered a fashion show, of course I did not win a trophy, in

those days they did not tell you what was wrong, so I had no idea what to do to make my outfit correct. This has now been changed which has helped everyone. So, get an outfit together and plan to enter every fashion show you can. When you are a contestant, you have a ringside view of everyone's outfit. Talk to them, you might learn something ... and you might even make a new friend! Author's note: Most of this article appeared in The Restorer about eight years ago, when I first wrote it, but it needs to be repeated now and then, for those who didn't see it the first time around.






