At each MAFCA National (every two years in July) financial grants are given to a number of young. people involved in the Model A Ford hobby. The purpose is to encourage and financially assist a young person with the restoration of a Model A Ford. The young person must be a member of MAFCA, be the title holder of a Model A Ford. and be under the age of 21. The awards are a combination of cash donated by numerous Chapters, and gift certificates donated by a number of major Model A hobby suppliers. The amount of the financial award each youth receives is determined by the total amount of cash and gift certificates donated in the previous two year period divided by the number of youth applicants. #### A History of the Orange County Model A Ford Club

The club was chartered in Aug. 1961 by an avid group of Model A drivers. The small group started out holding its meetings in the Isaac Walton Clubhouse in Santa Ana. The club was active "from the get-go" and took pride in driving and showing their cars. They also participated in many high school homecomings and parades. Main fund-raisers became 2 pancake breakfasts to fund the "Round-Up" which was held for many years at Knott's Berry Farm.
