

May Seminar:

The May seminar will be held at Glenn Johnson's house on Saturday, May 7, beginning at 0830. The subject will be a Summer Tour safety check for any and all cars brought to the seminar. June Seminar:

I have not organized a June seminar, as many of us will be on the three-week summer tour in June, including myself.

Aires water Inlet pipe A-8291-B:

Aires has offered to sell us their new stainless steel water pipe, p\n A-8291-B, at the discounted price of \$12.00 including tax and shipping with an order of ten units. Their regular price is \$16.00 plus tax and shipping. Both of the two previous orders of 10 were sold out at the March and April general meetings. I have since ordered another batch of 10. These will be made available at the May general meeting. The price is \$12.00 each. If anyone wants to be certain to buy a pipe at the May meeting, please call me (714-897-5861) and I will reserve a pipe for you. These pipes are made to the original Ford drawing (dated May, 1928) and look exactly like the original without the flat area, as do the current reproduction pipes on the market. They are made of stainless steel, so they will not rust out. The pipes are unpainted and can either be painted black to look stock or polished out to provide additional dazzle to a hot looking engine.

Aries Muffler Purchaser:

I announced at the April general meeting that the Aries muffler people have offered to sell us their mufflers at a quantity discount price. We need a quantity of 10 to qualify for a significant discount. The regular price for a standard muffler is \$189. plus tax and shipping. The regular price for a stainless steel muffler is \$275. plus tax and shipping. So far eight people have indicated they wish to purchase a muffler. It appears we will easily achieve the quantity of ten. I spoke with Aries and confirmed the pricing, which is indicated in the next column.

Regular steel muffler - \$173. including tax & shipping.

Stainless steel muffler - \$221. including tax & shipping.

High performance – Add \$15. to either regular or stainless steel.

The high performance feature is recommended for Model A engines that are 80-horse power or more. We can mix and match regular and stainless steel in the order. If you are interested in ordering a muffler please contact me, Tom Endy 714-897-5861. We will be placing the order after the May meeting.

Engine number stamp set:

The club owns a set of original looking engine number stamps. These stamps are used to re-stamp a serial number on an engine block. This would be particularly important to you if your car is registered in California against the VIN number that is stamped on your engine block, and you plan to change the engine. At the beginning of the year Roger Sowersby advised me that he had possession of the number stamp set. If you need to use them contact Roger.

Ford part numbers:

The Ford Motor Co. legal department has gone after Model A parts suppliers and demanded a 7% royalty on all reproduction parts they sell using the original Ford part numbering system. Bratton's Antique Auto has decided to not pay the royalty and has changed all their part numbers. I have not seen it yet, but I am told the new 2005 catalog will contain a new part numbering system with a cross reference to the old. Howard Barnes draws all of the illustrated parts diagrams in Bratton's catalog and they are copywrited. Bratton's pay a royalty to use them. The same drawings are in the Victoria Association features books. Howard Barnes waived the royalty fee as a donation to the scholarship program. Howard Barnes passed away a few months ago. ©

The Car Named Alice

The story of a club, a lady and a car

John and Alice Graves joined the Orange County Model A Ford club in 1997 and immediately fit right in, joining tours and seminars. At that time John was working on a 1930 coupe and as often happens, ran out of steam. The coupe found another home.

A nice 29 Town Sedan belonging to one of the members came on the market and they went to look at it with a friend who was supposed to know about these things. John and Alice "fell in love" and bought "Clara". Whose name was appropriately the same as Mrs. Henry Ford.

After the usual "nuisance" problems and installation of an overdrive, they were soon touring with the big kids even to the extent of *Deluxe Road* in a blinding rainstorm.

Alice and John took on the challenging job of editor and publisher of *The Distributor*, the club newsletter. Alice became treasurer and there was seldom a tour they didn't attend. As fate would have it *Clara* broke her overdrive repeatedly. The timing couldn't have been worse. They were registered for a NW regional meet in Surry Canada. Oh, what is a person to do?

Three days before the scheduled departure, with *Clara* out of commission, they bought *Henry*, who forever more shall be called "*Hank*". *Clara* was later adopted and is leading a warm and fulfilling life with Dick and Carmine Smith.

Hank made the trip to far away Surry Canada and back without a hitch. The Graves were a committed Model A family and decided *Hank* needed a sibling.

The sibling was in the form a huge load of parts, some appropriate and some in need of swapping and restoration. John referred to the "pile" as a 28,34 roadster pickup. A spare bed was swapped, a stray body was exorcized and the frame was "blasted and primed".

Alice's talents were now in great demand and she was elected president for the year 2002. Alice wasn't feeling well at the installation banquet and started a series of doctor evaluations. The final diagnosis was devastating. Cancer.

In late June a large group of us put together a "tour" to drive by and "ahooga" outside her home to show support. A phone call to John conveyed "she is asleep" but to come up anyhow and *stop*.

Memory fails me as to how many of us stopped that day but there were many. Alice was awake and alert. She spoke to each of us for a moment and when my turn came, she took my hand and told me "Keep John focused on the roadster pickup". I promised.

Only 3 days later, Alice left us, with an empty spot in our club and an empty spot in our hearts. The funeral was somber but the number of members and their Model A's told John we cared for Alice and we cared for him. There was little we could do but be here for him.

At the next club meeting, I revealed my promise to Alice and asked for help to fulfill that covenant. At that moment **The Car Named Alice** became the club's goal.

I will refrain from naming those who pitched in due to the risk of forgetting someone. Let it be known that MANY were there to help. John deserves the credit for restoring Alice but bits and pieces arrived when ready for assembly. A transmission, front end, rear end, complete brakes, assembly help, delivery and pickup of parts, tire installation, upholstery and top installation, body adjustment, engine installation.

Through his grief, John worked to create **The Car Named Alice**. Day after week after month **Alice** came together and she took her first outing to *Las Brisas* for brunch. No top, no bumpers, no confidence. Time and the club helped John through the worst of times and in 2004 he took on responsibility of the meeting raffle.

Today March 13, 2005 at the famed OCMAFCA pancake breakfast **The Car Named Alice** took her place among her peers and was awarded the best commercial award by popular vote.

Our lady named Alice can look upon her namesake with pride and her husband and friends who make it possible. Our club can also look with pride on **The Car Named Alice** and never forget our "lady" **Alice Graves.**

The OCMAFC has its own state of the art, brand new, best of the best, outstanding Hubley racetrack. This fabulous construction was completed due to hard and diligent work of Greg Carcerano (YEA!!!) with help from Dan Adelmann and assistance from Kenny Dierken.

Ready to try it out? Bring your Hubley (Gabriel or Scale Model) Model A ready to go at the MAY club meeting. We will have the track set up and working so you can race your car. The club is sponsoring the Hubley Derby at the upcoming Southern California Regional, so this is a great time to see how well your car runs. Below are the race rules:

- Cars must be metal 1/24 scale models made by Hubley, Gabriel or Scale Models
- Cars must be completely stock using original wheels, tires and axel screws
- NO modifications are allowed
- A dry lubricant (such as graphite) is allowed
 no oil, grease or liquid types of lubricants
- - Steering may be locked or free
- If weights are added, they must be secured tightly to the car.
- The Station Wagon weighs 21 ounces. All other body styles may have weights added to equal a maximum of 21 ounces. Any weights must be securely attached. Any car weighing over 21.0 ounces cannot enter to run.



Sam Craig, U.S. Army 1950-1952. Participated in Inchon Landing. Active in Korea for 11 months.

Piet Dwinger, U.S. Marines April 1961 to Aug. 1965.

Carl Erickson, US Navy 1951-1954.

John Graves, Army Signal Corps. 18 months, 1946-1947. (John's brother died in action.)

Bruce Harris, U.S. Navy 1961 to 1965.

Jon Heiland, U.S, Army. (I don't know the particulars, but I know he served.)

Pete Hyland, U.S. Army Nov. 1953-Sept. 1955.

Lee Jackson, Naval Reserve 1967-73. Active Jan. 1969 to Dec. 1970. Served on a nuclear sub. (Lee's dad served on a sub in WWII.)

Jerry Kalinowski, USMC from 1965-1969.

Terry Lucas, Naval Reserve 1967-1970.

Bernie Marston, U.S.Merchant Marine 1945. (He received an honorable discharge from the U.S. Coast Guard.)

Benjamin T. May, United States Marine June '94 to June 2000. Member of Marine Aerial Refueler Transport Squadron.

Dale McCall, Dec. 1952 to Nov. 1955. Served in Korea.

Merle McClellan, U.S. Army Signal Corps 1954-58.

Robert Meyerhof, Tenth Mountain Division (U.S.' only ski troops) Dec.'42 to Dec.'45. The Germans gave up to us before they surrendered on the French front.

Don Miller, Navy Air Traffic Control Operator Nov. 1944 until July 1946.

Les Nesbitt, USAF 1952-1955, Korea. U.S. Army Medical Corps and Calif. National Guard in recent years.

Jim Nichols, U.S. Army Aug. 1955 to Aug. 1958.

Ev Pearce, US Army Air Corps March 1943 to Feb. 1946.

Donald Ratzlaff, U.S. Army March 1954 thru Feb. 1956. Army Ski Patrol stationed in Garmisch, Germany.

John Riggs, Army Air Corps 1942-1945. WWII pilot.

Mark Schwing, Navy July 1959 until Jan. 1984.

Red Sickman, U.S. Army Military Police 1957-1960.

Don Steele, USN Jan. 1957-Dec.1960



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
