

Sunshine & Sorrow By Jeanne Parrish



August Seminar:

The August seminar will be held at Tom Endy's house. August 13, Saturday – 8:30 a.m. – Afternoon. This will be part two of a three-part Zenith carburetor seminar planned for July, August, and September. Part two will be a hands-on workshop to restore carburetors. The jet flow checking stand and the float valve checking stand will both be set up for use. Bead blasting, throttle re-bushing, and jet re-sizing tools will be available. The third and final seminar in this series will be held at Tom Endy's house in

Parts and Tools:

It is suggested that the following parts and tools be obtained. (Bratton part numbers)

Gasket kit	13820	\$1.25.
Plate screws	14170	\$.60.
Choke plate	14200	\$1.50
Bushing (two required)	14460	\$.75
Throttle shaft	14420	\$10.50
Gas Screen (brass hex)	14260	\$4.30 (or)
Gas screen (cad hex)	14280	\$3.90
Carb. wrench	14080	\$10.55 T-handle
Jet tap	14090	\$8.90 5mm,75 pitch

A set of very small drill bits ranging is size #61 down past a #75 should be obtained. These can be purchased at tool supply stores or hobby stores. Bratton does not carry them. These are used to re-size the jets. Also required is a pin vise for use with the drill bits.

Float valves:

Most original float valves can be re-used. If a replacement is needed, order an original type.

Float Valve, original 14300 \$4.95

Do not order the other two listed in the catalog. Both the ball type and the rubber tip type do not perform well with So. California gas. They will stick shut and you will have fuel starvation.

Paint:

A black paint that is impervious to gasoline is required. Airplane dope works well, but you cannot buy it in California any more. My preference is POR-15. ©

OCMAFC Military Veterans

Doc Ingwersen USN 1942-1983

In 1942, when I was 19 years old, World War Two became a reality for me. My mother was a member of the South Gate draft board, and she would have to draft me if I didn't enlist in the navy. So, on July 2, 1942 I became an apprentice seaman. Not too much changed in my life, I remained at home and continued with college. I was already enrolled at UCLA in pre-dental courses. In March 1943 I became a naval cadet when I transferred to the USC School of Dentistry. While I was at USC I became re-acquainted with a high school classmate I had casually known. Her name was Darlene. In December 1945 I graduated with a D.D.S. degree and a navy commission with the rank of LT (jg), and with orders to report to the Bremerton Naval Base in Washington State. I served there until I received orders to Yokota Air Force Base, Tokyo, Japan. A week's leave gave me just enough time to come home on Tuesday, July 2 and marry Darlene on July 5, 1946 and report back to Bremerton for transportation to Japan. Darlene had to remain behind in the states. I served 14 months at Yokota Air Force Base and was the only naval officer stationed there

I served 40 years in the navy as a reserve officer. I was promoted to captain April 7, 1979 and served as the commanding officer of the dental clinic at the Terminal Island Naval Base. I retired from the navy in 1983.

My son Bill Jr. also served in the navy and was stationed aboard the destroyer USS Maddox. The Maddox was one of two ships involved in the Gulf of Tonkin incident that led to the Viet Nam War. We attended the de-commissioning ceremony of the Maddox some years later and I was both surprised and pleased when I was given the honor of being piped aboard.

Upon returning to civilian life, Vintage Auto Parts & Jon became synonymous. Two locations in Santa Ana, a long term in Stanton & recently Fountain Valley with 3 different owners & always *Jon*. Behind the counter or in a parts trailer at the Turlock swap meet, there was Jon.

The Heiland family grew to 3 children. School, church & family made it hard to attend OCMAFCA, however, Jon found time to be president in 1986 & was ever present at the meeting to greet & introduce visitors & new members. It never failed, when it was asked, "Is there any old business"? Jon would reply, "Yes, Vince Mariola".

Santa Claus: Year after year Jon donned the jolly mans suit, called children's names to come up, sit on his lap, give them a present & produce the mandatory, "Ho! Ho! Ho!" The last couple of years we had a children's Christmas party, Santa was there, but with only a few grandkids & a couple of "borrowed" kids. Santa finally packed away his suit & retired.

While we will all miss "the grin" & won't be greeted at the meeting or Vintage, we know Jon is now with our other friends who have taken their last tour.

Jon has joined them in the most prestigious club, "The Heavenly Model A Ford Club". Picture them touring heaven in their 500 point Model A's: never a flat tire, bad condenser, rust in the fuel line, blown head gasket, boiling radiator, rain, fog, wind, traffic jam, broken over drive or running out of gas. Having Henry Ford along for the ride isn't too bad either.



Southern California Region Update



Articles from "The Distributor"

August 1965

The club meeting was held at the Izaak Walton Club House in Santa Ana. The club looked forward to the Idyllwild campout and tour. "The Distributor" editor received a letter from the national chapter coordinator commenting on our attractive paper. **Richard Parrish** was Round up chairman in 1965. The classified ads show Richard Parrish selling a 31 Dlx Coupe with a "C" engine and a roll down rear window. No price shown?? 1965 Roster showed 35 member families.

August 1975

The club meeting was held at Kiwamisland in Garden Grove with a potluck dinner—of Course! President Larry Conkol thanks the Marsh's, Vaughan's, Griffin's, Krist's, Yeaw's, Boef's, Douglas', Grunklee's, Johnson's, Plotkin's, Drott's and Conkol's. By displaying their cars at the Orange County Fair for 10 days, the whole club received free admission and parking at the fair.

1975 Roster showed 86 member families.

August 1985

The club meeting was held at Hart Park in Orange. "Time to Tour" by Jon Heiland says "potluck B-4 meeting." Miniature golf followed the meeting. Technical Director Dick **Riha** discussed the distributor and horn seminar.

1985 Roster showed 110 member families.

August 1995

The potluck at 6:00p.m. and meeting at 7:00p.m. at Hart Park. The Technical Director, **Dick Riha** was having a distributor rebuilding seminar at his house. A cruise night was planned at the Fashion Island Hard Rock Café. Angel baseball was scheduled at \$3.50 per ticket. with John's 1928AR for the 1920's and Glenn's 1934 Packard for the 1930's.




